

What is Lymphedema?

LYMPHEDEMA is a build-up of lymph fluid. Lymphedema often develops in the arms or legs when surgery or other treatments affects those areas, but it can develop in other parts of the body too.

What can cause Lymphedema?

- Cancer Surgery
- Radiation Therapy
- Infections that damage surrounding tissue or cause scarring
- Chronic health conditions
- Injury or Trauma

Why is it important to treat Lymphedema?

Lymphedema can sometimes become severe and cause serious problems, and often is a long-term or chronic condition. Untreated lymphedema can result in:

- Hospitalization
- Infection
- Disfigurement

What are signs and symptoms of Lymphedema?

- Swelling
- Skin feeling tight and/or hardening or thickening of the skin
- Aching or discomfort
- Feeling of heaviness or tightness in the affected area
- Reduced ability to move joints
