



Not every tree has a nickname, but the *The President* has earned it. This giant sequoia stands at 247 feet tall, has a width of 27 feet at its base, is the third largest tree in the world and is the the oldest known living sequoia, about 3,200 years old! Imagine, this tree was already 700 years old during the height of ancient Greece's civilization and 1200 years old when Jesus lived and Rome was well into its rule of most of the western world. Because of its unbelievable size and no clear shot, this tree has never been photographed in its entirety, until now. National Geographic photographers have worked along with scientists to try and create the first photo that shows the *The President* in all its glory.

They had to Climb the tree with pulleys and levers, and took thousands of photos. Of those, they selected 126 and stitched them together, to get this incredible portrait of *The President*." For prospective, look at the size of the person on the ground compared to the size of the tree.


