Cruising the Danube River:

Prior to the coronavirus, I made two trips cruising the Danube River. I will focus on the second trip as it covered a more diverse territory. So, let's start in Bucharest, the former capital of Wallachia and Romania since 1862. It is a beautiful city with broad tree-lined boulevards, well-kept parks and a mixture of architectural styles with Neo-Classical 19th century structures.

On a side-trip to Transylvania, we visited Bran Castle, built in 1377 and often referred to as Dracula's Castle. After the fall of the Soviet Union and years of legal proceedings, it is now back in the hands of its heirs and has become a big tourist attraction.

After three nights in a resort in Sinai located in the Carpathian Mountains, we were off to the Black Sea. The weather was beautiful as we arrived at Constanta, a Romanian seaport that is the oldest inhabited city in the country. There we saw Roman ruins dating back some 2500 years to when it was a Roman colony. Then I had another exciting experience, wading in the waters of the Black Sea on a beautiful, sunny day with a calm beach. What an experience for a kid who grew up in the arid Texas panhandle

After boarding our river cruise ship, we transited the canal from the sea to the Danube river. (I have to digress: At this very moment as I sit at my computer writing, the "Blue Danube" by Johann Strauss II just began playing on my radio. What timing! Now back to my narrative). Our first stop was Vidin, Bulgaria where we visited Baba Vida, a medieval fortress that was the city's main defense in the Middle Ages. This led to our next stop in Belgrade, the capital of Serbia (and former capital of Yugoslavia). An interesting site we visited there was the Tito Memorial and tomb with exhibits honoring Marshal

Continuing up river, we left the ship at Vukovar, Croatia, the site of the worst artillery shelling of the Croatian-Serbian war. There one could see the pockmarked buildings showing the scars of that war.

Late on our last evening we reached Budapest, Hungary. The views of the Parliament Building dominating Pest on the east bank of the river and

the Castle high on the hill in Buda overlooking the river from the west bank were beautifully lit-up at night.

The next morning, we toured of the twin cities, Buda and Pest and visited Heroes' Square with equestrian statues of the ninth-century Magyar leaders who conquered the region. Then we crossed the Danube and visited Castle Hill, where the Royal Palace has been wonderfully restored after being destroyed during World War II.

Unfortunately, our trip had to come to an end. Early the next morning we were transported to the airport for the return home.



Fairfax County COVID-19 Vaccine information

Fairfax County COVID-19 Vaccine Website

Starting April 18, all individuals in the Fairfax Health District who are 16 or older will be eligible to directly schedule a vaccine appointment through VaccineFinder.org as Fairfax County moves into Phase 2 with the rest of Virginia. This is a significant change in how to make a vaccine appointment. With this new system, Fairfax County will no longer be the primary registration point for the COVID-19 vaccine.

VaccineFinder displays available appointments from approved vaccine providers across the County, including the Health Department, pharmacies, hospitals, and some private practices.

To our Retirees:


It has been a very unusual year indeed, with a lot of challenges and hardships. All of us here on the Fairfax County Retirement Systems team hope that you and yours are doing well, or at least as well as possible during these trying times. Regarding your annual cost-of-living increase (COLA), I am pleased to say that we have a bit of good news. Your COLA increase will be **2.6%** this year.

As you may or may not know, per County Code, your annual COLA increase is based on the annual increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI-U) for the Washington-Arlington-Alexandria metropolitan areas. Specifically, it is equal to the increase in the CPI-U from March of the previous year (March 2020) to March of the current year (2021). The CPI-U is prepared and published by the US Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). You can read all about it on their website at: BLS

In simple terms, the Consumer Price Index is meant to reflect increases in the prices of things 'typical' people purchase. The BLS calculates these increases by analyzing actual increases in a range of goods and services typically purchased by typical people.

This year's COLA, at 2.6%, is the largest since 2012. You can see this in the chart below. And, most importantly, we will calculate and apply this increase for inclusion in your July benefit payment. It will be noted on that month's pay advice as well.

If you have questions or need more information, please reach out to a member of our Retiree Services team. They will be happy to help. We are still working remotely for the most part, but are monitoring our phones, emails, and physical mail every day. Hopefully, before

Safe Disposal of Medicines

Do you have unused or expired over-the-counter or prescription medicine in your cabinet? Dispose of them properly to help prevent misuse and accidental poisonings and to protect the environment. Wastewater Treatment Plants and Onsite Sewage Disposal Systems are not designed to remove these chemicals. As a result, these medications can end up in the environment and eventually in our drinking water.

The U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration, as well as local organizations, host

"take-back" days when residents can bring medicines to a designated site for proper disposal. Learn more about the National Prescription Drug Take-Back Initiative.

Fairfax County Police stations and area pharmacies now provide permanent drug disposal drop boxes where residents can safely dispose of their unused or expired medications any time of the year. For more information, go to MedReturns

Fairfax County Office of Elections

Vietnamese and Korean Speakers Needed as Election Officers for the June Primary Election.

The Fairfax County Office of Elections needs additional bilingual election officers to assist voters for the Primary Election to be held on **Tuesday June 8**, **2021** and in future elections.

Specifically, individuals who speak Vietnamese and English fluently or Korean and English fluently are needed to serve in Annandale, Centreville, Chantilly, and Falls Church.

Bilingual election officers will perform all regular election officer duties, including assisting most voters in English. But will be assigned to precincts with a significant number of voters who may primarily speak Vietnamese or Korean. Persons desiring to serve as a designated bilingual election officer must also complete a short oral language skills assessment.

Fairfax County is the largest voting jurisdiction in Virginia, with 243 precincts countywide. It takes thousands of enthusiastic and trained election officers to ensure that we have efficient and well-run elections. Compensation begins at \$175 and training is provided online for new officers.


