darkness for light and light for darkness, who put bitter

"Woe to those who call evil good and good evil, who put for sweet and sweet for bitter! -- Isaiah 5:20 esv

In his book, How Should We Then Live? The Rise and Decline of Western Thought and Culture, Francis Schaeffer wrote the following way back in 1976:

"Edward Gibbon (1737-1794) in his Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire said that the following five attributes marked Rome at its end: first, a mounting love of show and luxury (that is, affluence); second, a widening gap between the very rich and the very poor (this could be among countries in the family of nations as well as in a single nation); third, an obsession with sex; fourth, freakishness in the arts, masquerading as originality, and enthusiasms pretending to be creativity; fifth, an increased desire to live off the state. It all sounds so familiar. We have come a long road since our first chapter, and we are back in Rome."

That sounds like something he could have written that yesterday, doesn't it? Here we are on the cusp of a new year, and yet so many things seem so confused, so troubling. In fact, Isaiah's verse is more relevant now than ever, wouldn't you say, as we are seeing morals, ethics and justice spinning topsy turvy in so many ways in our culture and around the globe, ways that are very confusing and leave so many people uncertain about what is true, who is right and what to believe if anything. In recent months our streets have seen many protests and confrontations over a number of issues. At the same time we hear that pastors in the U.S. have left ministry in record numbers and churches are closing every week all across the country. (Though we should never forget that many parts of the world are experiencing greater revivals of people coming to Christ that have ever been.) The pope recently commented, referring particularly to American Catholic churches: "Christianity in America Is just a money making scheme," along with some other observations. There is definitely some truth in what he said, even though he himself dwells in the midst of one of the largest treasure chests in the world with wealth reaped around the globe throughout the ages! What is happening? Our church, of course, is not immune from the struggles of our times as we





seek not merely to survive, but to effectively share and represent Christ in these troubled times. Around the globe there are wars and international tensions galore, with news reports so varied that it is hard to know what the reality actually is and who, if anyone, are the people and views deserving of our support.

Do these things bring you hope, despair, or inspiration? Some believers I know see this as a moment of great hope, referencing scriptures such as Jesus' words that "there will be wars and rumors of wars" in the belief that all these things suggest we are in the very last days. Other believers express deep concern and discouragement, feeling that all their efforts and prayers seem to have no impact as culture spirals into evil after evil. And then there are believers who see all these issues as an urgent call to greater effort in "redeeming the time" by sharing the Gospel with people they meet while there is still time to do so before Christ returns. Do you relate to any of those options?

The other day I was reading in my copy of Morning and Evening by Charles Spurgeon, and ran across this paragraph, challenging us to remember the Lord's words from Isaiah 45:7-- "I form light and create darkness; I make well-being and create calamity; I am the Lord, who does all these things."

Spurgeon then writes:

"Gloomy seasons of religious indifference and social sin are not exempted from the divine purpose. When the altars of truth are defiled and the ways of God forsaken, the Lord's servants weep with bitter sorrow, but they may not despair, for the darkest eras are governed by the Lord and shall come to their end at His bidding. What may seem defeat to us may be victory to Him."



Are you looking to 2024 as a year to experience God's victory in your life, to see his victory in the world, and with the hope of his ultimate victory we shall witness when he descends from the heavens? Let us face this coming year with our heads held high, setting our minds on things that are above, while engaging in the great task of being his witnesses here below in a world where the darkness creeps in so incessantly. I have yet to see someone flip a switch that can cause darkness to dispel the light of even a single candle! Light ALWAYS wins!

Shine your light in 2024!



The meeting was attended by Marcia Hill, Mary Weldon, Mike Raasch, Betty Laughlin, Randy Cash, Joel Foreman, Larry Hill, John Mitchell and Dorothy Charleston.

Mike opened with a devotion entitled "Little Flower" followed by prayer.

Randy reported \$52,000 in the capital campaign. The checking account balance is \$62,159.43. A discussion of the office expense was held after Randy reported \$2,800 for the copier and \$2,800 for expenses.

Memorial Fund is \$15,784.18

Pastor entered via phone: the Wycliffe donation to be sent to Barb Waugh and be designated "Love Gift". The \$100 should be salary to Kodiak Baptist Mission. They are not receiving support from National Ministries. \$370 to be designated a "Love Gift" to them. All checks approved to be sent.

A discussion of the budget followed. Four percent raises, except for Amity. She requested 2% and 5 personal days off instead. All were approved. Betty made a motion to accept the budget. Second by John. Motion carried

Mary moved that checks be sent to Kodiak and directly to Barb Waugh. Marcia seconded. Vote was unanimous in favor.

The congregation will vote on the budget Christmas Eve morning.

John reported the new windows on the third floor are being replaced today. The third floor furnace will be replaced in the next two weeks. Larry reported activities on the bus and van. He will be taking John's position.


Betty continues sending cards for birthdays and anniversaries.




January People Puzzle
