MARCH 2021

Last March 1, in 2020, what were you planning for the year? Did you have travel plans? Perhaps that long awaited vacation to do a little sightseeing while getting away. Maybe you had scheduled some medical procedures or family reunions or big celebrations. I remember pretty clearly, nobody told me they were planning to take a year to stay at home, to quit going out to eat, to stop attending church, to quit shopping, to wear a mask everywhere you went all until somebody comes up with a vaccine...and maybe even longer!

The next thing that happened was that various governments—state, national, international—started prescribing various responses and restrictions to control the spread of the virus. Some places went into complete shutdown, scorning those who refused to do so. Other places did nothing, trusting “herd immunity” would arise and deal with the problem, thus rejecting the ideas of the other camp. Those states in lockdown were shocked when they discovered it didn’t curb the tide, as were those who longed for herd immunity. Wear masks, don’t wear masks, wear two masks, stay 6 feet away, no make that 25 feet if you talk loud, stay away from church and stay home, no be more careful at home because that is where most spreading takes place....we will have a vaccine soon...no, by the end of the summer, no by the end of the year. Now, after all the precautions and efforts, new, more contagious and more deadly variations are arising all around the globe, and everything had to be reassessed. Plans were made. Then they were remade. Then things changed and new plans had to be made. Might I offer a scripture: **The LORD brings the counsel of the nations to nothing; he frustrates the plans of the peoples. --Psalm 33:10**

You see, our plans mean nothing if they are not the plans God has for us. I recently read some comments about Lot and Abraham, as they separated and Lot chose the plush valley of Sodom and Gomorrah to live in, leaving Abraham to the wilderness. The commentator observed that Lot made his selection based on what he thought we make for the better life, but he did so without consulting the Lord’s desire as his first priority, and therefore did not bother to take into account the immorality of the environment he was entering. The long term result was disaster for the cities, for his wife, near disaster for himself and his daughters, and centuries of unrest among his descendants.

During the last twelve months, medical professionals, politicians, teams of experts all came and continue to come with their changing recommendations. Yet all I hear from many of these sources is how we are going to solve this, we can get through this, this disease won’t defeat us...we, we, we.... There are plenty of



passages that address the issue of the way we make our plans and the self-sufficiency we believe ourselves to have. Allow me to quote a couple that reflect a common theme—the first from the story of the tower of Babel, and the other are words of the prophet, Isaiah:

Then they said, “Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves, lest we be dispersed over the face of the whole earth.” --Genesis 11:4

The haughty looks of man shall be brought low, and the lofty pride of men shall be humbled, and the LORD alone will be exalted in that day. --Isaiah 2:11

God’s wisdom and purpose are what will prevail. As mere humans, we need to not start thinking we are so wise, so capable that we will be able to accomplish everything and anything. Right now, there is great celebration because of the forward steps accomplished with the recent landing on Mars, sending back videos and sound recordings. There is hope spreading because the vaccines seem to work well even with the deadly variants arising. But we need to beware, lest we start making a name for ourselves, instead of glorifying the name of Jesus. Superbowl rings, Oscars, Grammys, Nobel Peace Prizes, Medals of Honor...on and on we have ways that supposed greatness is honored. But when, like Lot, God is left out of the equation, it is a recipe for disaster. God humbles the prideful, and thwarts merely human plans.

Let me close with a simple question. What are you plans this year, for yourself, and for our church? Hopefully we all have learned the lesson last year that our plans, even the world’s plans, are subject to change by something as small as a microscopic virus. Let us make our number one plan to be to spend time discerning what God has planned for us, and then do our best to walk according to HIS plans! Let’s make sure that whenever we begin to plan anything, we take time to check God’s planner first!

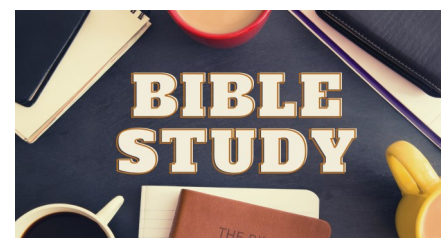

VISION TEAM MEETING: FEBRUARY 13, 2021

Members present: Pastor Richard, Joel Foreman, Mary Weldon, June Cardwell, Shelly Bowen, Mike Raasch, Eileen Cash, Marcia Hill, Randy Cash, Don Charleston, Judi Staab, and Dorothy Charleston.

Mike Raasch opened the meeting thanking everyone for coming as the outdoor temperature was extremely cold! He read an inspiration from Max Lucado referring to God's questioning Job in the Bible.

Activities discussed were the upcoming phone meeting with Kristi on the 28th. With things moving toward normal, communion will be passed tomorrow with precautions in place. A sign out front indicating we are open for worship was suggested.

Pastor told of visits made to people who live in Omaha and attend here. Pastor Richard reviewed the donations of food to Washington, and winter clothing to Linden schools. Valentine bags of toiletries and candy for staff and clients were donated to The Bridge. The outreach of the inspirational cards has been continued.

Randy reviewed the Balance sheet for January. The bank balance was \$4,662.40 at the end of January. There were \$10,000 in expenses in January. The offering last Sunday was \$6,350. The PPP loan has been forgiven with no qualification for another one.

In response to recommendations made by Personnel, Randy made a motion that whenever we bring in a substitute for the Ministry Assistant (formally Office Manager), the pay scale offered will be according to the same hourly rate as the custodian. Normally we have such substitutes come in for half a day. Motion seconded by Marcia and passed unanimously. This will be charged to the line for staff replacement on the financial report. 

The previously approved honorarium provided to Caleb as the substitute while Kristy is on leave of absence will be charged to the same budget line item.

Don made a motion to use Memorial Funds for the ceiling paint in the Parlor, kitchen, and hallway. Second was made by Shelly and the vote was unanimously in favor.

Don reported the snow removal was \$1500 for December. Indra gives us 10% discount on the snow because of our year-round contract. He also reported Pimpers are renting another office space as of the first of March.

If the washer/dryer (donated by Perry Laten) cannot be used by anyone in our congregation, it will be donated to Habitat, along with some vertical blinds.
