Beyond her religious commitments, Reverend Taylor is an administrator for Bartlett City Schools, extending ministry to around 700 individuals including students, families, teachers, and staff at Appling Middle School. Born in Canton, Mississippi as the seventh of eight siblings, Reverend Taylor pursued her education, earning a BA from Tougaloo College, an MAT from the University of Memphis, and an Ed. S in Leadership and Policy Studies from the University of Memphis. Known for her scholarly pursuits and love for scripture, Reverend Taylor excels in pastoral ministry, delivering clear and passionate sermons, leading with compassion, and setting an example for Christian living.

Reverend Taylor shares her life joyfully with her husband, Clarence, and their two children, Kelsey and Isaac. She acknowledges God as the source of all gifts and blessings in her life.

SPECIAL LISTENING SESSION WITH HHS

DR. QUE ENGLISH

Rev. Dr. Que English serves as the Director of the Center for Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships at the U.S. Department and Health and Human Services and works closely with the White House Office of Faith-based and Neighborhood Partnerships. The HHS Center's core focus areas include addressing COVID-19, maternal health, mental health in youth, suicide prevention, and substance use disorder inclusive of overdose prevention. Working with the Operating Divisions housed within HHS like the Center for Disease and Prevention Control (CDC) and Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and the Administration for Children and Families (ACF), Rev. Dr. English and the Center seek to address the priorities identified by the Biden-Harris Administration.

As a coalition builder and network strategist, Rev. Dr. Que English joins HHS from the State of New York where she served as the Deputy Director of Faith-Based Initiatives for the Governor's Office of Faith and Community Development Services. Here she identified opportunities to elevate strengths and identify new opportunities to build relationships with the faith-based community. She also conceptualized and was instrumental in forming the faith-based office in the Office of the Mayor of New York City.



She has brought together several roundtables and interfaith coalitions to create and implement strategic plans to tackle NY's most problematic issues.

She is the Founder and past President of Not On My Watch, Inc., an organization formed to combat human trafficking and domestic violence through education, training and community and policy advocacy.

In 2022, she was featured in City & State as 1 of the top 10 "100 Most Influential Religious Leaders in the State of New York" listing. In 2015, she was named 1 of 25 Most Influential Women in the Bronx. She was awarded the Sojourner Truth Award and the Bethune-Height Legacy Award by the National Council of Negro Women. These awards point to Dr. English's wealth of knowledge she brings to her current role from her advocacy work with the criminal justice system, to substance abuse issues, health and mental health, human trafficking, domestic violence, HIV/AIDS, civil rights and more. She received her Master and Doctorate degrees from New York Theological Seminary where she was the recipient of the Excellence in Ministry Award, the highest award given to a graduating doctoral student.

She also works extensively with Bedroom Kandi by Kandi Burruss to provide sexuality training and education to national based home party consultants. In her work with faith-based organizations, she has also conducted CBPR and provided training to over 90 churches across nine denominations using her evidenced based curricula and program entitled YOUR Blessed Health.

I AM the author of several books including WOMB Wisdom Oracle Cards and Journal, WOMB, . V! A love Letter To Every Woman And Girl, and F THAT! Don't Shrink! I AM also currently the Editor in Chief for Our Sexuality! Magazine, the premiere magazine for women's sexuality and sexual health. I AM a freelance writer for many online magazines, social media websites or her personal blog “Live Inspired Feel Empowered.”.

Dr. TaMara has a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) in Human Sexuality, Doctor of Human Sexuality (DHS), Master of Social Work degree with a clinical focus, Master of Science degree in Education and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Family Life Education.
