WORKS OF MERCY - In St. Faustina's Diary, she wrote, "Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be acts of mercy, and I demand the worship of my mercy through the solemn celebration of the Feast and through the veneration of the image which is painted. By means of this image, I shall grant many graces to souls. It is to be a reminder of all the demands of my mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works" (Diary, 742). Feed the Hungry, give Drink to the Thirsty, Clothe the Naked, Shelter the Homeless, Visit the Sick, Ransom the Captive and Bury the Dead; Admonish the Sinner, Instruct the Ignorant, Counsel the Doubtful, Comfort the Sorrowful, Bear Wrongs Patiently and Forgive Injuries. Pray for the Living and Dead.

BEGIN A NEW LIFE AFTER EASTER

The promise of the Resurrection is that faithful followers of Jesus will have new life. Whether we had a fruitful Lent or were lukewarm in our resolve, we can begin now to become new creations. Make an examination. Call on the Holy Spirit to reveal what is keeping you from becoming the person God intends. Make an examination of your life as you live it. Look at your prayer life, your sacramental life, your dedication to spiritual growth. Do you share your faith? Do you serve others with love? Face the truth with courage. It can be discouraging to look honestly at our many faults. Remember, though, that God understands we aren't perfect. He asks us to act with integrity and relentlessly fight against sin. Being a sinner is not the worst condition - remaining one is. Devise a plan - decide what needs to change. Write it down and commit to it. Sometimes making a brave life change entails leaving bad company behind. Often it means changing entrenched habits. Change may be uncomfortable but growth can't happen without it. Take the first steps. New life comes through God. Entrust your plan for change to Him. Spend at least 15 minutes a day in prayer, asking for inspiration and strength. Then take the first steps toward new life.

In the first Divine Mercy message, Pope Francis gave a powerful teaching on God's mercy. He spoke of how "true peace" comes from the experience of "God's Mercy", of Jesus Christ revealing Himself to us as "Mercy in the Flesh", and of our call to boldly "proclaim Christ the Risen Lord" by "trusting in the mercy of the Lord forever". Pope Francis also emphasized how Pope St. John Paul II established Divine Mercy Sunday. Over 50,000 who were present in St. Peter's Square heard this address that day. Pope Francis teaches us that Easter peace is the "fruit of the victory of God over evil" and the "fruit of forgiveness". God's victory over evil and forgiveness of our sins revealed is Our Lord suffering, death and resurrection. Pope Francis goes on to say that the key to our personal relationships with Jesus is our faith and trust in Him, as we are called to live by faith and not by sight. Through the eyes of faith, we are invited to a personal encounter with Him as Mercy in the flesh. In the light it makes perfect sense when Jesus told St. Faustina that we are asked to personally sign the Divine Mercy image with the words, "Jesus, I trust in You". Pope Francis encourages us to boldly witness to our faith in the Risen Lord by "trusting in the mercy of the Lord", the Spirit of the Risen Lord casts out fear from the hearts of the Apostles and pushes them out of the Upper Room, to bring the Gospel. We also must have more courage to witness faith in the Risen Lord! Let us not be afraid to be Christian and live as Christians! We must have the courage to go out and proclaim Christ the Risen Lord, for He is our peace. "Trusting in the mercy of the Lord forever, because He is waiting for us, He loves us" So, be encouraged by Pope Francis to boldly proclaim and live your faith in the Risen Lord. As you do, join in praying "Jesus, I trust in You"!
