CELEBRATE HOLY WEEK

HOLY THURSDAY - The celebration of the Lord's Supper and Veneration of the Blessed Sacrament. Marking the end of Lent and the beginning of the Holy Triduum, this special Mass remembers the institution of the priesthood and the Holy Eucharist. A procession with the Blessed Sacrament will be at the ending of the Mass as the Eucharist will be placed in the Chapel Repository until 9:00 PM. Traditionally, three Churches are visited on this day. It is scheduled at 7:00 PM.

<u>GOOD FRIDAY</u> - It is the only day Mass is not celebrated. This special Service that begins at 1:00 PM commemorates the Passion of Our Lord. The Passion story is read, the Cross is venerated and Holy Communion is offered. <u>Your offerings support the</u> <u>Shrines in the Holy Land.</u>

PLEASE NOTE: Please do not light any votive candles on Good Friday. It is not allowed by Church law. The time is marked by darkness because of the death of Jesus, therefore no lights can be lit. Thank you.

BLESSING OF EASTER BASKETS - Baskets can be blessed on Holy Saturday in the Church. It is scheduled for 11:15 AM. Place your baskets in the center aisle. Kids, don't forget your basket too.

HOLY SATURDAY - EASTER VIGIL - It is the Holiest of Nights. Tonight the Easter Candle is blessed, the Easter Water is blessed, we renew our baptismal promises, listen to God's Holy word and receive the bread of Life. Christ is our Light and our Salvation. It is scheduled for 8:00 pm.

<u>CHILDREN'S EASTER MASS</u> - We have traditionally celebrated the 11:15 AM Easter Mass for our children. We encourage families to attend this mass and have their children take part.

ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA DEVOTION - This devotion for thirteen weeks begins Tuesday, March 26th. The theme for reflection is: "<u>The Real Presence-The Holy Eucharist - Miracle of all Miracles.</u>" We encourage you to attend this devotion. The holy half-hour consists of prayers of invocation and gratitude to this great saint, the reflection and the blessing with the relic of St. Anthony. Hopefully we can keep these devotions alive!
