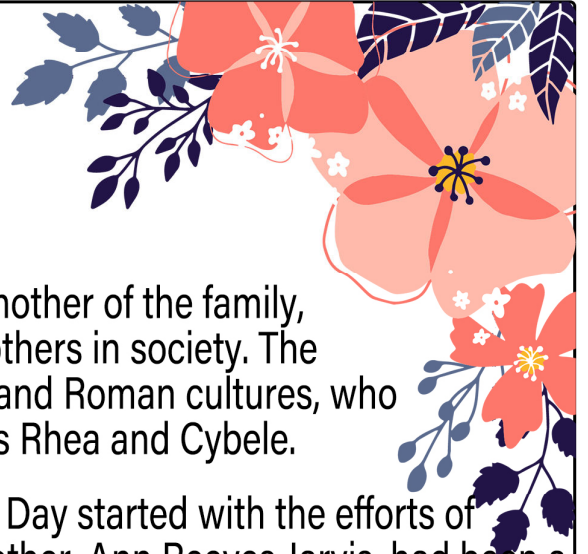

Mother's Day is an annual celebration to honor the mother of the family, motherhood, maternal bonds, and the influence of mothers in society. The origins of Mother's Day go back to the ancient Greek and Roman cultures, who had annual festivals in honor of the mother goddesses Rhea and Cybele.

In the United States, the modern version of Mother's Day started with the efforts of Anna Jarvis in the early 20th century. Anna Jarvis's mother, Ann Reeves Jarvis, had been a community activist and social worker who had organized women's clubs to improve public health in rural areas during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Anna Jarvis, after her mother's death in 1905, began campaigning for a national holiday to honor all mothers.

Anna Jarvis's efforts paid off in 1914, when President Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation designating the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day. The day quickly became popular, and commercial and cultural celebrations have been held ever since.

Mother's Day is a time for families to gather and celebrate the mothers in their lives. Modern celebrations often involve gifts such as flowers, cards, and chocolates, as well as a special meal or outing for the family. Religious organizations may hold special services to honor mothers, and schools may hold activities to celebrate the day.

Over time, Mother's Day has become not just a celebration of individual mothers, but also of motherhood in general. It is a day to acknowledge the hard work and dedication that mothers put into raising children and shaping society.

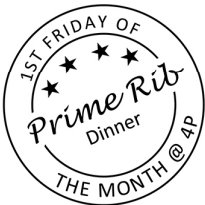

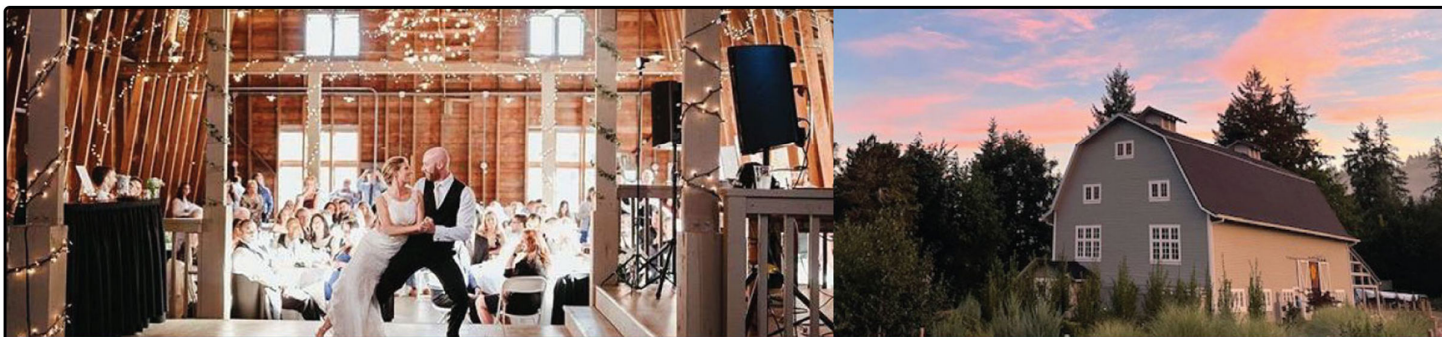
