- June 19th -- Juneteenth

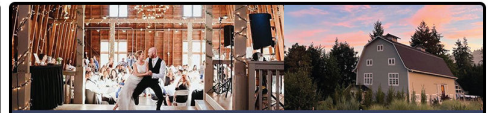
