Labor Day September 4th, 2023

Labor Day, celebrated on the first Monday of September in the United States, commemorates the contributions and achievements of the American labor movement and the overall impact of workers on the nation's development. The holiday has its origins in the late 19th century, a period marked by significant social and economic changes due to industrialization. The labor movement, advocating for better working conditions, reasonable working hours, and fair wages, gained momentum during this time. One pivotal event that led to the establishment of Labor Day was the labor strike and protest in Chicago on May 4, 1886, which culminated in the Haymarket affair—a rally for workers' rights that turned violent.

In response to growing pressure from labor unions and activists, the first Labor Day was observed on September 5, 1882, in New York City, organized by the Central Labor Union. The day was intended as a public demonstration of the labor movement's dedication to worker rights and social progress. Over time, the idea of Labor Day gained support, and more states began to recognize the holiday. In 1894, against the backdrop of the Pullman Strike, President Grover Cleveland officially established Labor Day as a federal holiday, a move aimed at fostering goodwill between the government and the labor movement following a period of tensions and unrest.

Labor Day has since become a time for Americans to reflect on the accomplishments of workers and the strides made in improving labor conditions, while also celebrating the broader contributions of labor to the nation's prosperity. The holiday is often marked by parades, picnics, and various festivities, serving as a way to honor the spirit of unity, resilience, and progress exemplified by the American workforce.

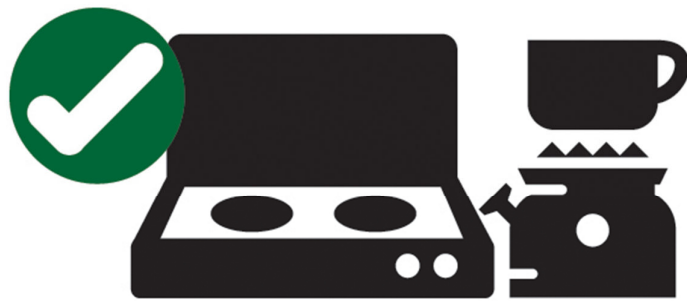

Permitted: Portable cooking stoves, propane campfires or lanterns using liquefied or bottled fuel.

CHEHALIS – Burn restrictions have been expanded for all of unincorporated Lewis County, effective immediately.

Lewis County Fire Marshal Doyle Sanford said the expanded burn ban prohibits all outdoor burning, which includes recreational fires. Until modified by the Lewis County Commissioners or the Lewis County Fire Marshal, only liquid gas or propane camp stoves that do not use solid briquettes and have on/off controls are permitted. This decision was made due to the continued, and in some parts of unincorporated Lewis County, worsening dry season conditions.

The Lewis County Fire Marshal, in coordination with the Washington State Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and Lewis County fire district fire chiefs strongly urges all county residents and property owners to be attentive to the conditions of their properties through proactive fire prevention measures.

“While the Board of County Commissioners and I recognize that this decision may alter recreational plans, the decision to expand the burn restriction to a total burn ban reflects the county’s priority of public safety and the protection of personnel as well as property,” Fire Marshal Doyle Sanford said.

The total burn ban, will remain in effect until further notice.

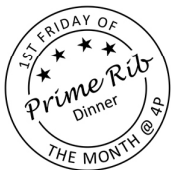

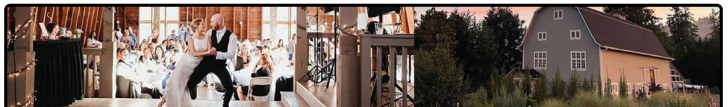

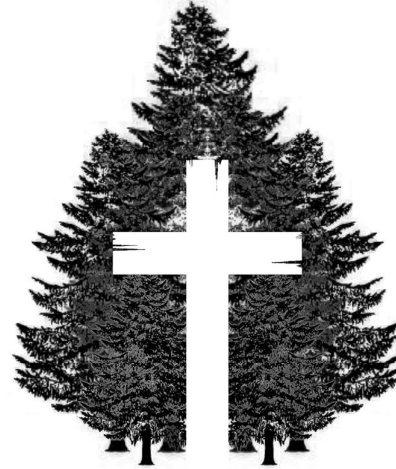
