McRoberts, Mayor Willey, Clerk/Treasurer Oster, and Attorney Unzelman were present. There were 2 citizens present as well as Dan Mortensen- Mayor City of Morton and Lewis County Commissioner Lindsey Pollock.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Nichols to approve the agenda. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. Motion passed unanimously (Nichols abstained)

A motion was made by C.M. Speer and seconded by C.M. Dodd to approve Blanket Voucher #202317 for Claim #'s 21205 and 21216-21237 in the amount of \$162,772.88 and for Payroll #'s 21206-21215 in the amount of \$22,419.84 for a Grand Total of \$185,192.72. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Nichols and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the purchase orders for required monitoring equipment and supplies at the Water Treatment Plant with an estimate of \$2357.43 including tax & shipping from USABluebook and an estimate

of \$2953.72 from Fire Mountain farms to have the dry biosolids removed from the WWTP. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Milanowski to approve the Utility Bill adjustments for Acct# 1619 Waive \$ 30.00 Late Fee, Acct# 1668 Waive Late Fee, and Acct# 1409 Refund of \$4.28 for overpayment on Final Bill. Motion passed unanimously.

Fund for costs that were associated with the Mauerman Rd. Water line replacement project. Motion passed unanimously.

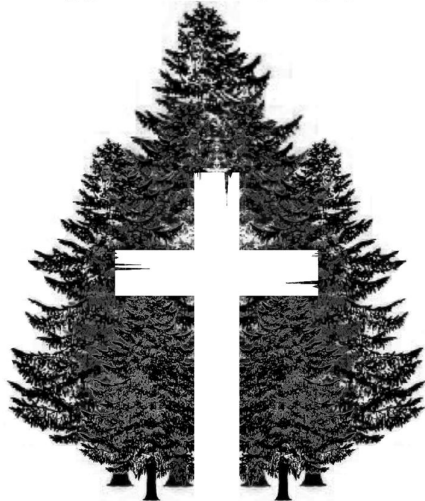
