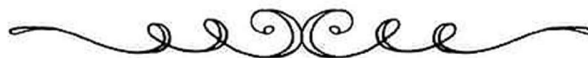

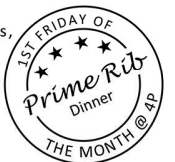

HYBRID MEETING- The regular meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Willey. C.M. Milanowski, C.M. McRoberts, C.M. Speer, Mayor Willey, Clerk/Treasurer Oster, and Attorney Unzelman were present. C.M. Nichols and C.M. Dodd were absent. There were 4 citizens present.

A motion was made by C.M. Speer and seconded by C.M. Milanowski to approve the agenda. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the minutes from the regular meeting on 10/17/2023 and the Special Meeting for the utility vehicle payment on 10/19/2023. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. McRoberts and seconded by C.M. Milanowski to approve Blanket Voucher #202321 for Claim #21306-21311, 21322-21323, and 21325-21344 in the amount of \$119,294.32 and Payroll #'s 21312-21321 in the amount of \$22552.82 for a Grand Total of \$141,847.14. (21324-voided) Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. McRoberts to approve the purchase orders for weight limit signs for the Kelso bridge from the WSDOT Sign Shop in the amount of \$556.20 not including tax and shipping, Replacement power supply for the composite sampler at the WWTP in the amount of \$1110.71, and approximately \$1800-\$2000 for a

psych eval., polygraph, and background check for the marshal position. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the utility bill adjustments. Motion passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS

A motion was made by C.M. Speer and seconded by C.M. Milanowski to table Ordinance #583- subdivision amending ordinance until after the first of the year. Motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

PUBLIC HEARING- The public hearing for the 2024 Preliminary Budget was called to order at 6:05 p.m. Clerk/Treasurer Oster explained the only significant changes to the budget were the police department, an upgrade to the new Vision utility software, and a new fence at Forst Lawn Cemetery. There were no questions or comments from the Town Council or citizens. A motion was made by C.M. Speer and seconded by C.M. Milanowski to close the public hearing at 6:10 p.m. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Speer to authorize the mayor to sign the Gray & Osborne Contract Amendment #1 for the WWTP & Lift Station Project #21223. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M.

Speer and seconded by C.M. Milanowski to authorize the Mayor to sign the Gray & Osborne Contract Amendment #4 for the Chehalis River Secondary Intake Project #22256. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Speer and seconded by C.M. Milanowski to authorize the Mayor to sign the Comprehensive Plan Consultant Contract with Stoney Beach Consulting. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Speer and seconded by C.M. Milanowski to approve the renewal of all current accounts currently under the Senior Discount Program because their income still qualifies them for the program. Acct. # 1502 was also renewed because they qualify under the new income requirements reflected in amending Ordinance #578. Clerk/Treasurer Oster is still waiting on documentation for 1 account due to an error in the list of accounts that are under the program, this account will be addressed at the next meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

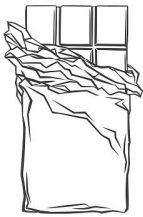

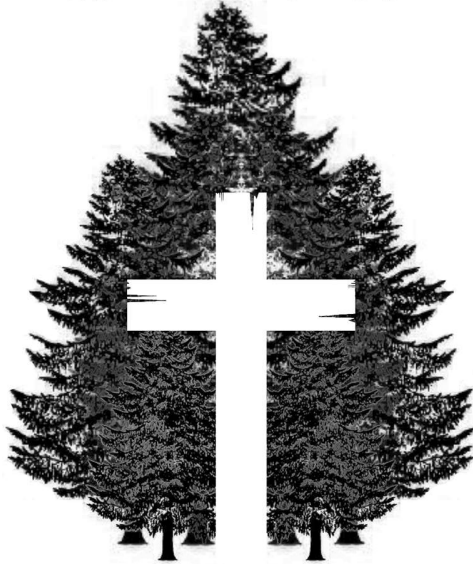

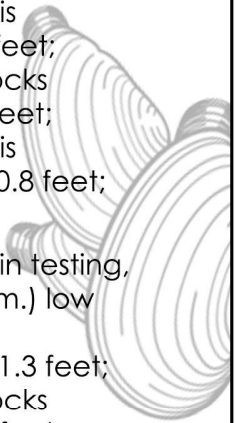
