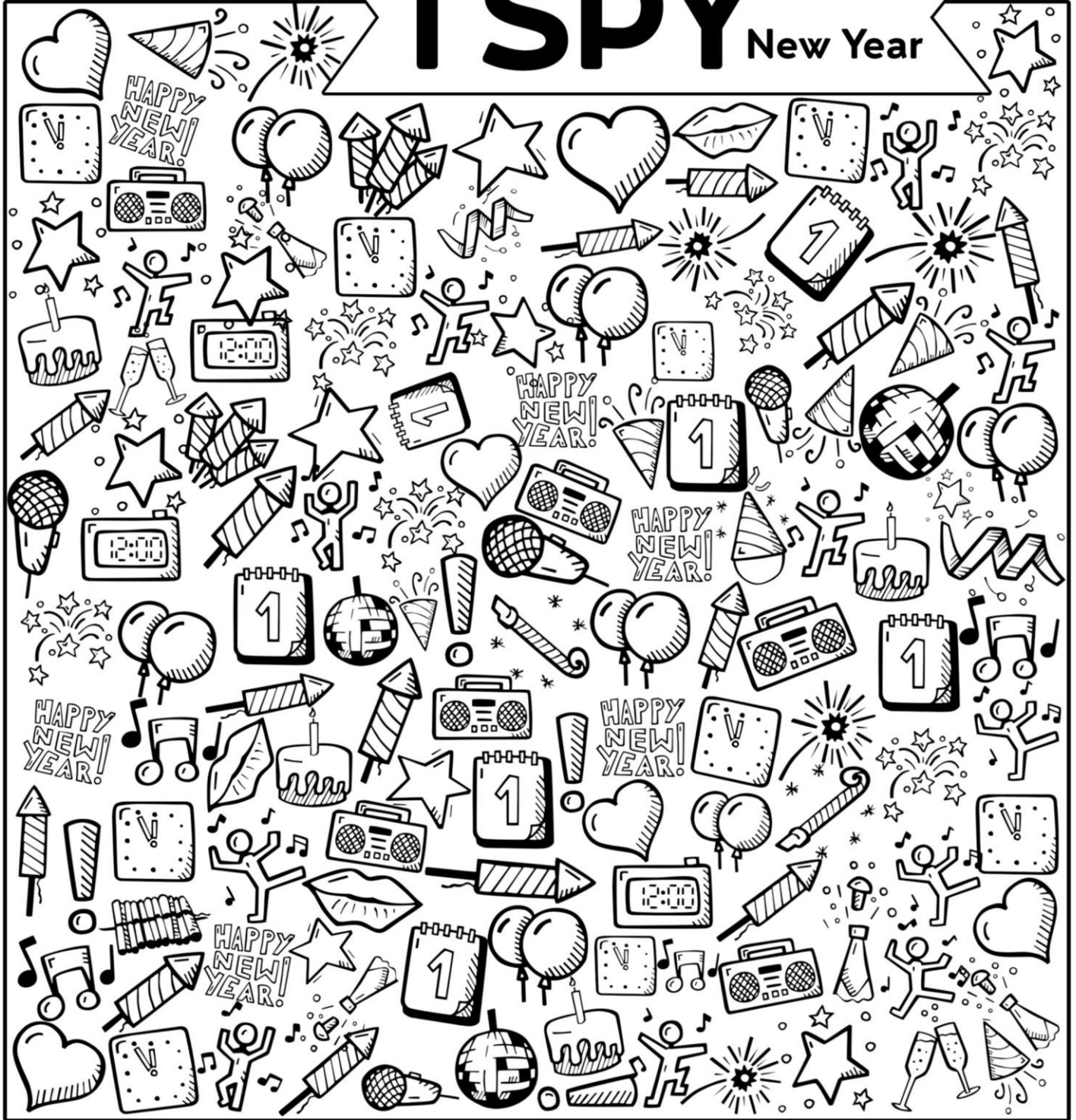




Join the Pe Ell Sun in ushering in a new year! It has been a great year and I thank you for all your support and kind words. I look forward to bringing you more great information in the years to come.

Sunday Afternoon Live extends a warm holiday wish to everyone by presenting a free concert on Saturday, December 30 at 2:00 PM: Musical Conversations With Tim Connell & Bernardo Gomez. This will be an opportunity to enjoy two world-class performers in an intimate setting, our own historic Raymond Theatre in Raymond, WA. Their performance will be free of charge, with donations gratefully accepted.

Tim Connell is an internationally recognized mandolin virtuoso, and Bernardo Gomez is an in-demand upright bassist who has played with many jazz and bossa nova bands. Together, they really do carry on a musical conversation. The two go traveling the genre road from Led Zeppelin ("Goin' To California") to the bluesy "Mr Natural", stopping off at the "Georgia On My Mind" station, throwing in a wonderful interpretation of Miles Davis' "All Blues", and sprinkling the mix with waltzes, klezmer tunes, and one of Bob Dylan's most poignant songs.

Both Mr Connell and Mr Gomez are extremely versatile—Bernardo Gomez finding a raft of ways to bow, strum, finger, and tap the strings; and Tim Connell applying his considerable talents to mandolin, guitar, vocals, and even the whistle. Add to all that virtuosity two very warm and enthusiastic performers—artists who smile and chat their way through their show—and you end up with a real appreciation for this art and their willingness to share it with us (in the dead of winter, no less!).

Let's spend some time in musical conversation—a lovely way to usher in a new year on a note of hope. We need it!

All of SAL's Season 20 performances will be held at the historic Raymond Theatre, 323 3rd St, Raymond, WA. Musical Conversations With Tim Connell & Bernardo Gomez is a free performance. Please note that this performance takes place on Saturday, December 30, at 2:00 PM.

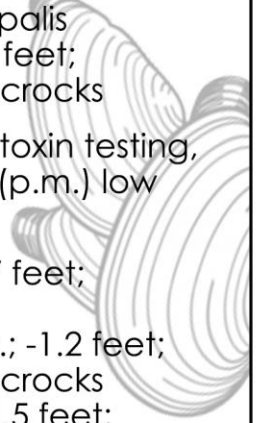

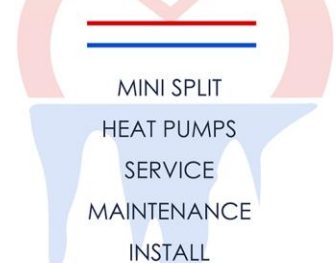

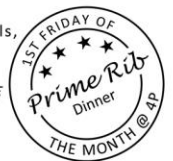

HYBRID MEETING- The regular meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Willey. C.M. Milanowski, C.M. Nichols, C.M. McRoberts, C.M. Speer, Mayor Willey, Water/Sewer Superintendent Webster and Clerk/Treasurer Oster. C.M. Dodd and Attorney Unzelman were absent. There were no citizens present.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the agenda. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. Motion passed unanimously (C.M. Nichols abstained)

A motion was made by C.M. Speer and seconded by C.M. Nichols to approve Blanket Voucher #202324 for Claim #'s 21388-21400 in the amount of \$341,002.20 and Payroll #'s 21385-21387 in the amount of \$2,150.00 for a Grand Total of \$343,152.20. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Nichols and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the purchase order to Butch's Heating and Cooling in the amount of \$619.85 for the emergency repair on Town Hall furnace. Motion passed unanimously.

McRoberts to increase the following employee monthly salaries as were budgeted for 2024 : Water/Sewer Superintendent Webster will increase to \$4728 from \$4503, Utility Maintenance Dale Randall to \$3096 from \$3023, Utility Maintenance Speer to \$2948 from \$2808 upon passing of the WTP1 test, Clerk/Treasurer Oster to \$5720 from \$5373. Motion passed unanimously.
