



HISTORY MONTH

Black History Month, celebrated annually in February, is a dedicated period that honors and recognizes the significant contributions and achievements of African Americans throughout history. Originally established as "Negro History Week" by historian Carter G.

Woodson in 1926, it expanded to a month-long observance in 1976. This commemorative month serves as an opportunity to highlight the struggles, triumphs, and cultural richness of the Black community, acknowledging the pivotal role African Americans have played in shaping the United States and the world. It is a time to reflect on the resilience of individuals who have overcome adversity and discrimination, as well as to celebrate the diverse and impactful cultural, political, and artistic legacy of the Black community. Through educational programs, events, and discussions, Black History Month aims to foster a greater understanding and appreciation of the often overlooked contributions that have shaped the nation's history.





National Freedom Day is an observance in the United States that commemorates the signing of a resolution that later became the 13th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution. The 13th Amendment, which was adopted on December 6, 1865, abolished slavery in the United States. National Freedom Day is celebrated annually on February 1st.

The idea for National Freedom Day was introduced by Major Richard Robert Wright Sr., a former slave and a prominent African American businessperson, in the early 20th century. He believed that the abolition of slavery marked the true birth of freedom and wanted to create a day to celebrate this important milestone in American history.

President Harry Truman signed National Freedom Day into law on June 30, 1948, making it an official observance. The day is not a federal holiday, but it serves as a reminder of the ongoing struggle for civil rights and the importance of recognizing and promoting freedom for all individuals. Many people use this day to reflect on the progress made in the fight against slavery and discrimination, as well as to promote understanding and goodwill among all Americans.

National Wear Red Day is an annual event in the United States aimed at raising awareness about heart disease, particularly in women. It is observed on the first Friday in February each year. The initiative is part of the larger Go Red for Women campaign, which is organized by the American Heart Association (AHA).



During National Wear Red Day, individuals are encouraged to wear red clothing to show their support for the fight against heart disease and to raise awareness about the importance of heart health. Heart disease is a leading cause of death for both men and women, but the awareness campaign focuses on women to dispel the myth that heart disease is primarily a "man's disease."

The goal of National Wear Red Day is to encourage people to take steps to improve their heart health, such as making healthier lifestyle choices, knowing their numbers (blood pressure, cholesterol, and glucose levels), and supporting research and education initiatives related to heart disease. The red attire serves as a visible symbol of solidarity and commitment to this cause.
