USAPO National Plowing Competition in Greenwald, MN August 18-20, 2022

The 2022 USAPO National meet was held August 18-20 in Greenwald, MN on Nietfeld's farm. Standard classes were offered for the USAPO National, namely, Antique, Open, Small Plow, and Reversible for Senior and Junior participation. This year there was also a Vintage Small Plow Class that was run with the Small Plow Class. Curiously, there were no Junior competitors this year. I find this a bit troubling because the Juniors are the future of this sport.

The match was organized by the Minnesota State Plowing Association with special thanks to Joe Loehr and family, Mike Chouanard, Mike Penas, Dan and Jan Nietfeld, plus many others in the club too numerous to mention.

I got a practice plot completed on the 18th but when it rained overnight, I had memories of a previous National in MN. Conditions were kind of muddy the next day. However, the parking area was probably the most hazardous place to get stuck which resulted in most people parking on the road. Additionally, the Minnesota organizers were well prepared and had a backup plan. The competition plowing was held on some alfalfa stubble, just up the road from the planned field. Even though there was rain coming down on farms all around us, there was not much rain on our field, just a bit of a drizzle.

Great food was available at the plow site provided by the SJSA School, Conrad and Sandy Gruber plus others helped man the food table. The Plowperson's banquet was at the Greenwald Pub on

Thursday August 18. The pub is clearly one of my favorite places to eat and I made every effort to eat there whenever I could.

From my point of view the 2022 National Match was very well organized with very good plowing conditions. The alfalfa soil conditions were excellent for the competition.

Scoring Special Committee Report – Landowners have brought to our attention that dead furrows are not of good quality in some instances. There is concern that the points awarded for the finish were undervalued and that more points should be associated with the finish (dead) furrow. It was argued that if more points were awarded for the finish the final furrow quality would improve. WPO awards 25pts from a total of 130, Ontario awards 40pts from a total of 200, and USAPO awards 40pts from a total of 170. It was recommended by the USAPO board that the value of the finish points be left alone. However, IA will add 20pts to their score sheets.

The breakdown time correction, the unplowed ground definition, and wheel tracks definition will be addressed at a later date.

World Ploughing Organization Ploughing Competition in Portlaoise Ireland September 18-21, 2022

Hailey Gruber and Kevin Albrecht were our plowpersons for the 2022 WPO World Ploughing in Ireland this year. Gene Gruber was the coach and Joel Wagner was the USAPO judge (my first time). When Peg and I got to Ireland, Kevin and the Grubers were already there for preprepractice plowing. Our team worked quite closely with the Canadian team including rooming at a rented farm house and practicing.

Our teams made arrangements for practicing on sod and stubble (at the rented farm house). I learned quite quickly that GPS in the car is the only way to get around in Ireland. There are no straight roads or logic to the layout of byways. Kevin gave me easy directions to the sod practice the first day I was there; take a right, take a right, take a right and the farm is on the left. I drove all over for about an hour till I found a sign that said 'To Portlaoise'. I got Peg's phone with GPS at the hotel and drove to the field. It was a rainy misty day and I tried to help Kevin as much as I could. Ireland is stony ground – not rocks, but stones.

We spent a good time with Brian Davenport and Daryl Hostrawser, the Canadian plowmen for conventional and reversible, respectively. We had a wonderful time with the Canadian plowmen, the Canadian Coach/Judge Greg Timbers and Keith Davenport, a good friend and plowing judge from Ontario. After the preprepractice week we all stayed at The Maldron Hotel, Portlaoise. I thought the practices went well. Hailey had her usual equipment from MN and Kevin had his tried-and-true reversible outfit from SD.

As a judge I didn't get to see much competition plowing by our USA plowpersons. I judged conventional stubble the first day and reversible sod the second. I understand that both of our plowpersons had some issues during competition. I recall Kevin got a stone stuck between the coulter and the share on his opening pass on the first day and had a hydraulic issue the second day on sod. From the opposite end of the plot I saw Hailey's tractor not moving the first day on stubble

near her finish pass and a team of people working on the tractor only to find out later a hydraulic fitting failed and squirted hot oil all over Hailey! I've included a scan of the overall placing of the results below.

I'm very proud of our USA plowpersons. They did very well at the world level and look forward to them representing USA in future WPO meets.

As a special note, I have to give a tremendous amount of credit to Roger Neate for being the USA judge in many previous years. It is very hard work. I'm guessing I walked several miles, many on rough plowed ground, on each day. And sod judging was in the rain! I was on a 3-person team with Norway and Germany. They were repeat judges and taught me a lot about judging at the world level.

We gave out very few 9's and 10's. We rewarded great plowing but also gave out some very low scores when things went south for the plowmen. Just so you know, the judges do not contribute to the judging discussion for the plowpersons of the judge's country. As a final note, I would say the points awarded to high scorers were not necessarily 8's, 9's, or 10's but were generally above average scores on most of the aspects that were judged. You don't have to be the best in every aspect but do have to be good in every aspect.

Toward the end of our stay in Ireland, there was some talk of the 2023 WPO meet being in Latvia. We will need to stay tuned to Conrad Gruber as our USA WPO Board member.
