

Maryland county celebrates unveiling of memorial for Medal of Honor recipient Sgt. Alfred Hilton

(Tribune News Service) — Harford County on Friday celebrated the unveiling of the Sgt. Alfred B. Hilton Memorial at the David Craig Park. The memorial commemorates Harford County's only Medal of Honor recipient.

The Havre de Grace site features a picture of what is believed to be Hilton and his unit and the flags of Hilton's country, state and county. Hilton's personal history is engraved on the back of pictures of Hilton's unit.

Hilton is one of 16 Black Union Army soldiers who received the Medal of Honor for their service during the Civil War.

According to the Sgt. Alfred B. Hilton Memorial Fund, Hilton was born in the Hopewell area of Harford County, now Level, around 1842 to Harriet and Isaac Hilton, free citizens who had formerly been enslaved in the county.

Hilton enlisted with the 4th Regiment United States Colored Troops in 1863 and was made a color bearer in 1864, tasked with carrying the national flag into battle.

On Sept. 29, 1864, Hilton and his regiment advanced ahead of Union troops against entrenched Confederate defenses at Chapin's Farm outside Richmond, Va. — a critical engagement during the war, according to the foundation. Hilton was wounded but continued to advance, picking up the regimental standard from another fallen soldier and carrying the national and regimental flags forward until he was unable to go farther.

FREE ENTRANCE TO NATIONAL PARKS FOR GOLD STAR FAMILIES AND VETERANS

The National Park Service in partnership with Operation Live Well would like to thank military personnel and their families for their service and invite them to enjoy their national parks.

The free Military Pass is a way to thank current US military members and their dependents, Gold Star Families, and US military veterans for their support of our country and to encourage them to explore recreational opportunities on their public lands and waters.

A free **lifetime Military Pass** is available for Gold Star Families and US military veterans. A free **annual Military Pass** is available for current US military members and their dependents. The passes provide free access to more than 2,000 federal recreation areas, including national parks, wildlife refuges, and forests.

What is the Military, Veterans, and Gold Star Family Free Access Program?

The Interagency Military Pass covers entrance fees and standard amenity fees (day use fees) at lands managed by the National Park Service, US Fish and Wildlife Service, US Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, Bureau of Reclamation, and US Army Corps of Engineers for current US military members, and dependents of current military members, US military veterans, and Gold Star Families. In recent years, they were able to receive annual passes. The new interagency Military Lifetime Passes will be available starting November 11, 2022.

The free Military Pass waives entrance fees and does not cover expanded amenity or user fees for activities such as camping, transportation, special recreation permits, reservation fees or special tours.

Who is eligible to get a free Military Lifetime Pass as a veteran?

For purposes of this program, a veteran is identified as an individual who has served in the US Armed Forces, including the National Guard and Reserves, and is able to present one of the following forms of identification to get the Interagency Military Lifetime Pass when entering a national park:

- Unexpired Department of Defense Identification Card (DD Form 2, DD Form 2765, or Next Generation USID replacement)
- Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC)
- Veteran ID Card
- Veterans designation on a state-issued US driver's license or identification card




Did you know...?

AMERICANS FIRE FIRST SHOT AT PEARL HARBOR

The first of many Pearl Harbor facts many people don't realize is that on the morning of December 7th, 1941, the Wickes-class destroyer USS Ward attacked and sank a Ko-hyoteki-class midget submarine near the entrance to the harbor, making it not only the first shot fired on that day, but the first official American shots in the War. The minesweeper Condor spotted the Japanese sub's periscope above the water, which alerted the crew of the Ward, who opened fire on the intruder. Unfortunately, the reports from the Ward were discounted and disbelieved by Navy brass. Something they'd pay dearly for. The ship's crew didn't get confirmation that they'd sunk the submarine for over 60 years.

ATTACK ON PEARL HARBOR LASTED 75 MINUTES



The Japanese attacked military airfields at the same time they hit the anchored fleet. The Navy air bases at Ford Island and Kaneohe Bay, the Marine airfield at Ewa and the Army Air Corps fields at Bellows, Wheeler, and Hickam were all bombed and strafed as other elements of the attacking force began their assaults on the ships moored in the Harbor. The purpose of the simultaneous attacks was to destroy the American planes before they could fly and intercept the Japanese.


