From Around the Corps

Marines on Okinawa stand up a littoral regiment to join sister unit on Hawaii

CAMP HANSEN, Okinawa — The Marine Corps on Wednesday launched a new seaborne quick-reaction force on Okinawa as friction between U.S. regional allies and China is on the rise.

The 12th Marine Regiment became the 12th Marine Littoral Regiment during a sunlit morning ceremony on Camp Hansen's football field. The littoral regiment — typically about 2,000 Marines — will specialize in stand-in force operations, a key tenet of the Marines' revamped islandfighting doctrine, Force Design 2030.

A stand-in force is a small, mobile unit inserted within enemy missile range to seize and hold key islands and deny enemy vessels access to surrounding seas.

"Today marks a significant milestone in the storied history of 12th

Marine Regiment as a transition to the 12th Marine Littoral Regiment," Maj. Gen. Christian Wortman, commander of the 3rd Marine Division, said during the ceremony.

This transformation is "a direct response to the dynamic defense landscape that we face in the 21st century," he said. The new littoral regiment is not focused on any particular nation, but is prepared to face evolving regional threats, Wortman said after the ceremony.

The redesignation came less than a day before President Joe Biden is scheduled to meet Chinese President Xi Jinping in San Francisco during the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation summit. The leaders are expected to discuss topics ranging from the resumption of military-to-military contacts to the wars in Gaza and Ukraine.

The Pentagon's 2022 National Defense Strategy identified China as a global pacing challenge. The communist nation, with its modernizing and expanding military, has provoked U.S. allies Japan and the Philippines in the East and South China Seas. The U.S. is bound by treaty to come to their defense.

Plans for an Okinawa-based littoral regiment were first announced in January by the Japan-U.S. Security Consultative Committee, or 2+2. The new regiment is the second of at least three planned for the Indo-Pacific. The 3rd Marine Littoral Regiment was launched in Hawaii in March 2022.

Dear Friends,

It's with a heavy heart that I share that former Secretary George Owings III passed away yesterday morning after a brief battle with cancer.

George, in many ways, embodied what Veterans can do after they've completed their time in uniform and become leaders in their communities and across the state.

It's safe to say that few people have had a greater impact on Maryland veterans than Secretary Owings. His experience as a Vietnam Veteran and Marine led him to recognize the need for a state-level Department of Veterans Affairs to advocate on behalf of our community and assist veterans, service members, and their families in accessing the benefits they've earned through uniformed service.

As a leader in the House of Delegates, he had the foresight to champion the legislation that turned the Maryland State Veterans Commission into the Maryland Department of Veterans Affairs. Anyone who took a walk with him around Annapolis would quickly realize that he was a beloved figure who had the relationships needed to pass the legislation creating the Department in 1999.

Following the Department's creation, he worked alongside many of you - members of the veteran community and MDVA employees alike - to build the organization we know today during two tours as Secretary. Whether championing legislation to help veterans, or advancing efforts to secure the resources needed to build a second Veterans Home in Sykesville, George was a tireless advocate for veterans and his legacy will be felt for many years to come.

For many of you, he was a mentor and a friend and his loss will be long felt. I hope that you will keep his family in your thoughts and prayers and join me in honoring his service to our state and to the country.

Veterans Day was a great opportunity to show our appreciation to those who have served and we're thankful to all of you who organized events all across the state.


To ensure that our gratitude goes beyond words, Governor Moore signed two executive orders and helped us launch a new initiative focused on Veteran and Military Families.

VA releases National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report For Immediate Release: November 16, 2023

WASHINGTON — Today the Department of Veterans Affairs released the National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report, the largest national analysis of Veteran suicides through 2021 (the latest year for which we have data). The report shows that 6,392 Veterans died by suicide in 2021, which is 114 more than in 2020. The number of non-Veteran suicides also increased to 40,020 deaths in 2021, which is 2,000 more than in 2020.

2021 was the first full year of the COVID-19 pandemic, which led to greater financial strain, housing instability, anxiety and depression levels, and barriers to health care - all of which are known to be associated with increased risk of suicide for Veterans and non-Veterans alike. There was also an increase in firearm availability in 2021, which is proven to increase both the risk of suicide and the risk of dying during a suicide attempt.

Ending Veteran suicide is VA's top clinical priority and a key part of President Biden's Unity Agenda. Since 2021, VA has worked aggressively to expand support for Veterans in crisis, including offering no-cost health care to Veterans in suicidal crisis at VA or non-VA facilities; launching the 988 (then press 1) to help Veterans connect more quickly with caring, qualified responders through the Veterans Crisis Line; partnering with community-based suicide prevention organizations to provide Veterans with on-the-ground support; expanding firearm suicide prevention efforts; and encouraging Veterans to reach out for help through a national Veteran suicide prevention awareness campaign. These steps have led to more than 33,000 Veterans getting free emergency health care, a 12.1% increase in use of the Veterans Crisis Line, more than 3.5 million visits to VA's support website, and more.

Moving forward, VA and the Biden-Harris Administration will continue to work urgently to end Veteran suicide through a public health approach that combines both community-based and clinically based strategies to save lives.

"There is nothing more important to VA than preventing Veteran suicide —nothing," said Secretary of Veterans Affairs Denis McDonough. "One Veteran suicide will always be too many, and we at VA will use every tool to our disposal to prevent these tragedies and save Veterans' lives."

"We will do everything in our power to learn from this report and use its findings to help us save lives," said VA Under Secretary for Health Shereef Elnahal, M.D. "It will take all of us - working together — to end Veteran suicide, and we will not rest until that goal becomes a reality."






