VA READY TO OFFER COVID-19 BOOSTERS

WASHINGTON — The Department of Veterans Affairs has started administering Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine boosters under Emergency Use Authorization.

This decision follows the Food and Drug Administration's authorization and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommendation for a booster dose of Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine to:

People 65 years and older and residents in long-term care settings should receive a booster shot of Pfizer-BioNTech's COVID-19 vaccine at least 6 months after their Pfizer-BioNTech primary series.

People aged 50–64 years with underlying medical conditions should receive a booster shot of Pfizer-BioNTech's COVID-19 vaccine at least 6 months after their Pfizer-BioNTech primary series.

People aged 18–49 years with underlying medical conditions may receive a booster shot of Pfizer-BioNTech's COVID-19 vaccine at least 6 months after their Pfizer-BioNTech primary series, based on their individual benefits and risk.

People aged 18–64 years who are at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission because of occupational or institutional setting may receive a booster shot of Pfizer-BioNTech's COVID-19 vaccine at least 6 months after their Pfizer-BioNTech primary series, based on their individual benefits and risks.

1 October 1997

Gilda A. Jackson becomes the first African American Female Marine Colonel.

6 September 1983

On October 5, 1775, the Second Continental Congress held a meeting in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in which they used the word "Marines" on one of the earliest known occasions.

9 October 1917

On October 9, 1917 the 8th Marine regiment was activated at Quantico, Virginia.

While the regiment didn't see combat in Europe during World War I, the regiment did participate in operations against dissidents in Haiti for more than five years during the 1920s. During World War II, the regiment was assigned to the 2nd Marine Division and participated in combat operations on Guadalcanal, Tarawa, Saipan, Tinian, and Okinawa, earning three Presidential Unit Citations in the process.

28 October 1962

10,000 Marines of the 5th Marine Expeditionary Brigade left Camp Pendleton by sea en-route for the Caribbean during the Cuban Missile Crisis.

A week prior, the entire Marine Corps had been put on alert and elements of the 1st and 2d Marine Divisions were sent to Guantanamo Bay to reinforce the U.S. Naval Base.

31 October 1919

A Marine and gendarme, led by Sergeant Herman H. Hanneken, disguised themselves as Cacos and entered the headquarters of the Haitian Caco Leader, Charlemagne Peralte, killing Peralte and dispersing his followers. Sergeant Hanneken and Corporal William R. Button were each awarded the Medal of Honor for their respective roles in the mission.

MARINES HELPING HEROES FOUNDATION

The Marines Helping Heroes Foundation was created by members of the detachment to assist in various fundraising endeavors.

The foundation has since become an IRS 501(c)3 tax exempt organization in its own right. The foundation is chartered in Maryland and conducts business separate from the detachment.

The detachment and the foundation work closely together to meet their mutual objective to serve and support our local active duty Marines, veterans, and other heroes.



BIERUT BOMBING 1983

On Oct. 23, 1983, 220 Marines, 18 U.S. Navy sailors, and 3 U.S. Army soldiers lost their lives in the Marine Barracks at the Beirut Airport. You are not forgotten.

October 23, marks the anniversary of the single deadliest day for the Marine Corps since Iwo Jima in World War II. However, the chain of events that led up to this tragic event began more than a year prior, in June of 1982.

On June 6, 1982, the Israeli Defense Forces invaded southern Lebanon in response to an assassination attempt on Israel's ambassador to the UK by Palestinian terrorists, in an attempt to create a buffer zone between Israel and a joint Palestinian Liberation Organization (PLO) and Syrian force stationed in Lebanon. After two and a half months of fighting, a 2,000 member multinational peacekeeping force, including 800 Marines from the 32d Marine Amphibious Unit (MAU), was deployed to Beirut to oversee the withdrawal of PLO guerillas on August 25th.

FREE FLU SHOTS

If you are a Veteran enrolled in the VA Maryland Health Care System you can receive a free flu shot in several different ways this flu season.

One of the simplest ways to get a flu shot is at a community retail pharmacy listed below. Veterans must be enrolled in the VA health care system and have received care through the VA, either a VA or community provider, within 24 months to be eligible to receive a free flu shot from a retail pharmacy. These include:

CVS	Safeway
Costco	Walmart
Kroger	Wegmans

No appointments or referrals are required to get a free flu shot at these pharmacies, but please call the pharmacy before visiting to ensure they are participating. Also, remember to take your VA Health ID card and another form of ID, along with this email (print it or snap a picture of it with your smartphone) and show them to the pharmacy staff. They need the coding information listed below to bill the VA instead of charging you.

Group - RX3841

After receiving a flu shot at a retail pharmacy, please notify your VA primary care team so they can include this in your VA medical record. You can do this in person during your next scheduled primary care appointment, by mailing or faxing a copy of your flu shot information, or by sending it via Secure Messaging through MyHealthVet.

Flu shots will also be available throughout the VA Maryland Health Care System as listed below:

During scheduled face-to-face primary or special care appointments at all VA Maryland Health Care System facilities.

During walk-in flu shot clinics on Tuesdays and Thursdays between 9 a. m. and 11:20 a.m. at the following locations:

Baltimore VA Medical Center – 2nd floor, Canteen Dining Area

Cambridge VA Outpatient Clinic – Primary Care Clinic

Perry Point VA Medical Center – Building 314, Gymnasium

For medical advice, our Telephone Care Line is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week at 1-800-865-2441.

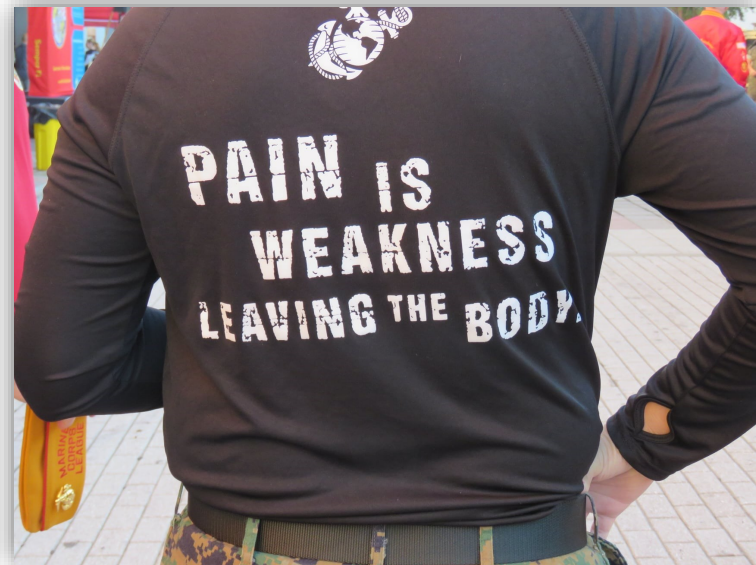
