
# THE LISTENING POST

My friends,

Lent is nearly here. Yes, we just took down our Christmas decorations (well, some of us. Maybe not all of us. And that is totally okay.) Stores at least took them down and immediately put up Valentine's decorations, candy, cards. And right next to the big red hearts, there are big pastel eggs. Fluffy ducks and chicks. Chocolate bunnies and crosses (don't even get me started on the weirdness of a chocolate cross.) If it feels fast and really soon this year, it's because it is. Because Easter is considered a "moveable feast," due to its dependence on lunar cycles, the date for Easter, and therefore the start of Lent, is not fixed in our calendar. The earliest possible date for Ash Wednesday is actually February 4 (last happened in 1818, but won't happen again until 2285.) So February 14 is pretty early, but not the earliest.

Okay, but why does this matter for us? Weird calendar details don't necessarily make for great "monthly newsletter fodder." Perhaps

not, but you know what does? Realizing that there are things that we still don't know when it comes to our faith, our beliefs, who we are as people of God. And when there are things we don't know, what do we do?

Some people sit in their lack of knowledge and do nothing. There's something to be said for that in a positive way...because with God, there's no way we will EVER know EVERYTHING. And so we must, therefore, realize that there is mystery to be embraced in following Jesus. Some, when faced with questions, will go to the ends of the earth for answers, poring over library books and old newspaper articles and listening to podcasts. This is what I typically do. When our daughter received her autism diagnosis, I went on Amazon and immediately purchased different books on our ride home. When trying to know more about the things my new friend Geoff really liked, I read 4 Neil Gaiman books and started to read George R.R. Martin's books (I didn't finish because wow...those are way too detailed and long.) Then, we have people who fall on the "in between" of that spectrum. They want to learn more, but realize they can't know it all. And they're okay living in that space. They have conversations with their friends and family about the new things they're learning, hear other points of view, and take some of it to heart.

And all of these people can be found in the church.

I know a lot of people still give up things for Lent, and that's okay. But I like to try and do something "extra" during the season. Once, I tried doing more silent retreats (dumb idea.) Another year I tried a new vegetable each week (I still hated all of them.) Still another, I worked through an app called d365 that provided a devotional and prayer each day. I loved that. This year, I think I may try to read a new book each week on something or someone I don't know much about. In Proverbs 18, we are told that the "wise...are always learning, always listening for fresh insights." (Proverbs 18:15, The Message) This feels like a good place for me to start.

While preparing our hearts for a season of turning toward God, let us also consider

how to turn our minds and bodies toward God as well. See you on Valentine's Day, I mean, Ash Wednesday!

About videoing our worship services ..... \*First, we have been asked to have Pastor Niki followed with the recorder during worship so that when she leave s the pulpit those tuned-in aren't just staring at an empty area. This would make the service more engaging for those watching from home. And, it is thought that while Pastor is among

the congregation, those at home may be able to hear better. \*Second, this may or may not raise some privacy issues for those in the congregation. We follow all rules and guidelines which protect our youngsters and this includes signed parental permission slips allowing for photos, filming, etc. This applies to anyone under the age of 18. We do not require this of adults and recommend that if you don't want to be filmed for Facebook Live, please choose your seating in the sanctuary accordingly.

\*Third, the videoing responsibilities have seemed to have landed as one person's responsibility which makes it difficult for him to take a day off. We are not asking for someone to sub on a regular basis, only to volunteer to be able to video when Derek can't be here or just needs a day off. More than one person wanting to volunteer would be perfect. Please talk to Derek (he's the one with the video equipment) or call the office if you'd like to be an on-call substitute.

\*Lastly, we've had very good comments about the convenience of watching from home during illness or in climate weather.

This offering is such a blessing to many and we're hoping to make it not so restrictive for any one person.
