Girls Soccer Drops Season Opener, But Wins Home Opener By: Coach Travis Heystek

Cadillac Heritage Christian fell to Buckley 3 to 6 in a cold season opener on Friday, April 5. The Patriots got out to an early lead with an unassisted goal

by Lily Bigger, but the Bears replied with 3 goals of their own before half-time. The Heritage offense struggled to generate any forward momentum with possession being maintained by Buckley's offense most of the game. The Bears scored another goal soon after half-time to make the score 4-1. Senior

Lily Bigger responded swiftly with her second unassisted goal of the night to make the score 4-2. Buckley replied with two more goals. In the closing minutes of the second half, Lily Bigger rounded out the hat trick with her third goal, assisted by freshman Madeline Nichols.

Freshman Marley Shepardson did an outstanding job playing keeper in her first start, coming up with 16 saves.



On Tuesday, April 9, the Patriots pulled off a last minute win in their home opener against Midland Calvary Baptist Academy. The CBA Kings got out to a quick start going up 3-0 in the first half before senior Lily Bigger responded



with a goal on an assist from freshman Belle Besmer. The two made a formidable duo to finish out the second half controlling the ball on Midland's half of the field. Lily Bigger scored a second goal before the half ended on a penalty kick after being fouled in front of Midland's net. The Patriot defense, came out stronger in the second half, proving to be too

much for Midland to net anymore goals. Senior Natalie Vanden Berg scored her first goal of the season on a penalty kick after Midland was called for illegal use of the hands in the box. The game was tied with both teams at a stalemate, unable to move the ball deep into each other's territory for most of the second half. With just over 3 minutes left on the clock, Lily Bigger scored her third goal on an assist from 8th grader Trinity Brubaker, resulting in her second straight game with a hat trick.

"The girls played awesome tonight, making adjustments at the half to play with more aggression and intentionality. As the season continues we look forward to seeing some quicker starts and more shots on goal as the girls have now scored 7 goals on 11 shots this season" said Coach Heystek.



The Patriots now sit at 1-1 on the season. They will be back in action next week when they travel to Remus to take on Chippewa Hills on Tuesday, April 15 at 5:30 p.m. They will be at home next Thursday, April 18 when they host TCBAA at 5:00 p.m.
