### The Future of the American Church + It's impact on the Archdiocese of Philadelphia Part 1

No doubt, many of you have a sense that in the last couple of decades, there has been a steady drop-off in participation in the life of the Church among those who identify as Catholic and those actively participating in the life of the Church. This trend is something that all religious institutions have been experiencing, both within the Protestant and Jewish churches. Within the Catholic Church, the most recent statistics show that only 17% of all people who identify as Catholics are active in their faith. which means they participate in the Eucharist each Sabbath and do their best to live according to the teachings of the Faith. It is an understatement to say that this is alarming! Like everyone else involved in the life of the Church, the American Bishops, along with concerned laymen, have been tracking this trend and are asking ourselves, "What about the other 83%?"

Another alarming statistic that has grabbed Church leadership's attention is the significant drop in the number of men

ordained to the priesthood. The same can be said of women entering the Religious Life. For example, during my ten years in the seminary, 90 + men were members of my class somewhere during those ten years. When the dust settled, 34 were ordained {2 for the Diocese of Kentucky, 4 for the Diocese of Allentown, and 28 for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.} The total number of men ordained for Philadelphia over the last ten years was???

The trends are undeniable, and responding can no longer be delayed.

In 2021, the Bishops recognized that the American Church must do two things: 1) find creative [not gimmicky] ways to bring back those among the 83% who have lost any attraction to the Church and a belief they can encounter God through it. 2) Prepare the Dioceses of the American Church to devise and implement a new understanding of what it means for Catholics to be Church.

Guided by several dedicated and talented laymen, the initial studies exposed three painful but apparent realities: 1) We must downsize. 2) We must emphasize quality over quantity. 3) We cannot be afraid to consider new models of the Church. Ironically, the

"new" model they returned was not new; instead, it was to return to the experience of the Ancient Church. They may have been a minority and suffered the prejudices of their surrounding culture, but those early Christians were filled with the joyful and confident spirit of the *missionary*. They may have had zero resources as we understand resources today, but they had an abundance of Faith and were filled with the Master's Peace. The cynical may feel this last observation is naïve and powerless; yet, through the inspiration of Our Lord's Holy Spirit, those persecuted generations of Christians managed to convert the pagan Roman Empire within three centuries.....all because they believed something Our Lord had impressed upon them at their Baptism; namely, the responsibility of offering everyone in their lives Our Lord's Good News!

Next week, I will resume this commentary with *Part 2*. It won't be super-detailed, but I hope to convey a sense of this process and how they see everyone's part in it.
