Message from Pastor

When you walk into any number of retail stores at the end of January, you can't help but see red. No, I don't mean that you'll be furious. I mean you will literally see the color red in front of your eyes. Since a time shortly after Christmas Day, the displays of goods for sale in the prominent shelves right in front of the entrances have been dominated by red-colored items. There are bags of candy, cutesy stuffed animals, and boxes of cards for kids to fill out for their classmates. Of course it's the annual display for Valentine's Day, or as a young kid that I once knew used to say, "The love day."

Each February 14<sup>th</sup> seems to be pretty much the same thing. The stores have their trinkets for sale. The day gets closer, and the flower shops begin to take more than the usual amount of orders, especially for roses. The price of those flowers gets higher and higher as the day gets closer. Men are reminded over and over again in commercials that the day is coming quickly, and they better make a big deal out of it or suffer the wrath of their significant other. Of course, many men won't give it much thought until the 13th or 14th when they'll stop into a store on the way home and grab something because they've been made to feel like they have to. Some couples will find a little romantic magic in the day, especially if they're in a newer relationship, and kids will hand out treats and cards to each other at the annual school Valentine's Day party. And those who find themselves in the category of "single" will find some way to distract themselves from all of the hype. It's pretty much the same thing every year.

Of course, February isn't only about Valentine's Day this year, at least for many Christians. Once again this year, February also contains the day that we call Ash Wednesday to mark the beginning of the Lenten season. This time of the Church Year focuses on an extended period of repentance and preparation for observing and celebrating the Passion of Our Lord and then His Resurrection.

During this time of Lent – which comes from the Latin word for "spring" – Christians observe 40 days of self-reflection to help us focus on the depths of our sinful nature, and to remember how much Christ had to endure and suffer to pay for our sin. There are a number of ways that you are encouraged to do this. The first is extra time in worship.

#### Message from Pastor continued....


Just like our Advent preparation period before Christmas, there will be special times of prayer and worship at each congregation on Wednesdays (1:30pm at Bethlehem and 7:00pm at St. John) throughout the season beginning on Ash Wednesday.

An additional way to prepare is the old tradition of giving something up for the season of Lent, which is actually the old practice of fasting. Many people choose to refrain from doing something or eating something for the 40 days of Lent, and this is certainly a good practice to observe. But there's another part of this fasting tradition that is often overlooked. The original intent of giving up something for Lent was to give yourself extra time to spend in prayer or in reading God's Word. So, if you do choose to give up something such as your favorite food or snack, you should plan on using the time that you would have spent eating and preparing that food to spend extra time in prayer or meditation on God's Word.

That brings me to my final suggestion for how to observe this Lenten season, and that is with extra personal time reading God's Word. If you want to do that, there will be a special sheet available for you on Transfiguration Sunday, February 19<sup>th</sup>. That sheet will have a reading plan for the New Testament on it, and if you follow that reading plan from Ash Wednesday through the Sunday of Pentecost it will take you through the entire New Testament.

Each year the Old Testament reading for the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday is from the prophet Joel. Give special attention to his words once again this year, and hear their call to prepare for Christ's Passion. "Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster."

Secretary minutes from our last meeting on Oct. 23 was reviewed and approved.

Pastor gave his report. Attendance was good for Advent and Christmas. We look forward to Ash Wednesday on Feb.22'nd. services will be 1:30 at Milan and 7pm here at St John. Synodical convention is this year in Milwaukee. We all are welcome to attend. The opening service is especially spectacular. 
