Message from Pastor

As I write my article for this month's newsletter, midweek LifeLight Bible Study on the Book of Revelation has passed its midway point. As the participants of this study have learned, the final book of the Bible tells us many things about our world both for today and for the future. But the most important event that we are told about is the Advent of our Lord, Jesus. Not His first Advent, but His second one.

As the Church Year comes to its close at the end of November, the Christian Church turns its liturgical focus to the return of our Savior to bring this world to its end, and to restore it to the perfect state that God originally created it to be. The Book of Revelation gives us several incredible descriptions of what that will be like, even as we come to realize that we can hardly imagine it with our limited and sinful human minds. The seventh chapter of the book though, tells us about an incredible gathering of people before the Throne of God, so many that no one can count them. It is the gathering of All Christian Saints to celebrate what the Lamb of God has done for us with His sacrificial work.

The first day of November – All Saints' Day – is when Christians throughout the world will celebrate this great multitude once again, and a number of congregations, such as ours, will also celebrate it on the next closest Sunday to that day. It is a special celebration to give thanks to our Lord God for the faith that He has generously given to so many people throughout history. Pastor and author, William Weedon, in his book *Celebrating The Saints* describes this particular festival for us with these words, "With overflowing joy, the Church of Jesus Christ celebrates the Feast of All Saints' Day...

"The joy of this particular feast is in its celebration of the unity of the Church Triumphant (the saints gathered already into [eternal] rest) and the Church Militant (the present and future Church that struggles still under daily crosses). Together, both constitute but one communion, one fellowship.

"They are the crowd...a vast multitude beyond human numbering and calculation. What makes them one is what they have received from the Lord: They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. Their sins are forgiven and they hold the palm of victory He has placed in their hand.

"If you look at the crowd, you can [tell] that some were among earth's famous and powerful. Most were quite unknown to history. There are some black, some white, and every color of the flesh of humanity. Some were very wealthy on earth; most quite poor. Some spoke this language, others that. They come from every nation and tribe. What is most captivating about them, however, isn't their diversity; it's the unity of their attention. They aren't paying the least bit of attention to themselves. They are united in their gaze upon the Lamb on His throne, the Lord Jesus Christ victorious in His sacrifice of love. And therein lies the secret to becoming part of that crowd. You do so not by squeezing in and trying to imitate the look of astonishment and awe upon their faces. Rather you share their blessedness by joining in what they are so fixated upon: Jesus Christ, who humbled Himself to become what they were (a child of man) in order to lift them up to become what He is (children of God)." – until next month! John Quarterly Voters Meeting Minutes October 22, 2023

21 members signed in and the meeting was called to order by Stephan Schneider in Doug Brown's absence. Pastor opened with a prayer. The previous quarterly meeting minutes were reviewed and approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor reported that the outdoor worship went well and that more would be done in the future. Confirmation has resumed on Wednesday nights. Bible study has had good attendance using Concordia's Life Light Revelation. Advent services are being planned. There will be three Wednesday evening Advent services at St. John with afternoon services at Bethlehem. Christmas eve falls on a Sunday this year so there will be regular morning services that day and an evening Christmas Eve service. Reformation will be celebrated next Sunday and All Saint's the following Sunday. Attended a pastor's conference about Holy Communion and the life of the congregation and came back with good ideas.

Elder's Report: Stephan Schneider reported that he met with the Deputy Sheriff regarding safety of our facility. The deputy said that in case of an armed intruder, it would be best to have only one open entrance during events. Also, that security cameras should be at all entrances. The Safety Committee will be looking into this. Several members attended the Defending Religious Freedom conference. The focus of the Lutheran Center for Religious Liberty is to make sure that church and state are separate and to make sure that religious freedom stays free.

Outreach: No report

Parish Board of Education

Youth: First event the end of August had 9 kids. Sunday youth Bible study has 7 kids between St. John and Bethlehem. An event is planned for 10/27/23 and on 10/29/23 there will be a meeting to discuss attending the Higher Things Youth Gathering in 2024.

Sunday School: On 10/29/23, Sunday school will celebrate Reformation Sunday. On 12/3/23, milestone gifts will be given to the children from the congregation.

Treasurer's Report: Kay Christiansen reviewed the income and expenses. We are doing okay as expenses are down as well as giving. We continue to fall short of the income needed to meet budget.

Trustee's Report: Ryan VanDerLeest reported that they met with the Fire Extinguisher service and received recommendations to upgrade extinguishers, which will be done over the next 5 years. Outside lights should be done by the time of Advent services. The pest control company reduced our bill by \$100 and told us to donate it to our congregation. The suggestion was made to post a map of the facility that showed exits, fire extinguishers, etc. which will be done by the Safety Committee.

Financial Committee: Jeff Werner reported that they are counting money during the week when they have large amounts of money, like the Harvest Supper and Christmas services. This is less stressful for the counters. With the new year coming, some counters' terms will be up and more volunteers will be needed.

Cemetery Committee: Reminder to get all decorations off of the cemetery by 11/1/23. Still need 2 more people on the committee.

Unfinished Business

Harvest Supper: Nancy Witucki reported that God heard our prayers and blessed us with a successful 2023 Harvest Supper. Despite our lack of phone service in the church office Monday and Tuesday and slim manpower throughout the day Saturday, our 52 volunteers prepared and served 432 meals for our community, Senior Living homes and homebound. This meal is appreciated by all. People look forward to it each fall. The need for extra strong workers to help move roasters is still a challenge for us. Our crew had to help in multiple areas in order to fill in where needed. Again, extra strong workers are a must for this event to continue.

Generous congregation and community support brought in donations of \$4942 plus a \$250 Thrivent card. Our expenses totaled \$2042.90. \$3149.10 will be donated to a Christian nonprofit organization.

After hearing the report, a motion was made and seconded to donate the proceeds to "Labor of Love." This initiative with the LCMS North Wisconsin District is a fund used to reduce the debt of NWD called workers.

Location of the new church sign on Highway 97 and Huckleberry: Discussion about the sign being in an illegal spot. Marathon County Planning and Zoning has been contacted and has not come out yet to look at it. A motion was made and seconded to direct the Church Council to direct the sign committee to correct the sign location.

New Business

Elections for new board members: This will be done at a Special Voter's meeting in the future.

Budget: Discussion points below regarding the Building & Grounds area of the budget.

Chancel renovation project: Motion made and seconded to table this until a committee is formed to gather information and present it to the voters. Motion made to remove this item from the budget.

Parsonage siding, windows, insulation: New estimates were received and air conditioning will be added to the work. The amount to do this work would be \$77,000. Motion made and seconded to update amount in the budget.

Other changes to the repairs/maintenance – church: All items were removed from this section except Boiler Repair (\$800) and Incidental Repairs/Maintenance (\$2000). Motion made and seconded to update this in the budget.

New item amounts:

Repairs/Maintenance - Church - \$2,800.00

Repairs/Maintenance – Parsonage – \$79,000.00

Total Building and Grounds - \$108,765.00

Motion made and seconded to accept the new budget.

Chancel renovation project Committee: Ryan VanDerLeest, Cathy Schneider, Lloyd Schultz, Pastor Mathey

Adjournment: Motion made and seconded to adjourn.

Closing prayer: Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
