Pillar of Service

As Catholics, we are called to spread the Good News. Perhaps this week you can invite a friend to say grace with you before a shared meal or to accompany you to Mass. Your invitation may be the catalyst for something great in their lives.

What a Week!

The past week has been filled with spiritual, natural, and cosmic wonders that have grabbed our attention. We began the weekend with a 4.8 magnitude earthquake shaking buildings, homes, and pictures off the wall and ended with a once-in-a generation solar eclipse! As I reviewed the scriptures from Holy Week, I was reminded during the passion and crucifixion of our Lord that the "sky became dark, the earth quaked and rocks were split". Here at St. William's, we also experience the powerful effect of God's love and mercy at our Divine Mercy service with the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal. The parish was blessed to have 18 Friars from Most Blessed Sacrament Friary in Newark, New Jersey come to celebrate two of our masses and offer a prayer service that focused on repentance from our sinfulness and the hope of God's forgiveness. At 3 PM, "the Hour of Mercy", Fr. Stephen Dufrene, CFR challenged and encouraged us to seek an encounter with the Lord in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and to be prayed with and over by the CFR prayer teams that were present. Adoration, prayer, praise and worship music, and confessions continued until 7pm! The ground shook spiritually on Sunday!

During this Easter Season, the Church presents to us excerpts from the Apostles preaching and inviting the people of Israel to have faith in Jesus Christ, the Risen One. These early experiences of the Church were similar to what occurred here last Sunday. Like St. Peter, we have been called to conversion and forgiveness and to tell others about our own faith journey – to make the ground shake by our prayer. Jesus saves, He forgives, He restores us. Like in the upper room, Jesus is hungering for our souls to bring us peace. Confession gives us the opportunity to mend our ways and repent, to meet mercy, and to begin again. The disciples were scared and hid from the Jewish leadership, but also from the Lord. We too can do the same when we stumble in our sinfulness – we can be eclipsed by the darkness of our sin. Jesus offers us forgiveness - His mercy penetrates the darkness, and He introduces us to a "right" relationship with God and the community of the Church.

I am so grateful for the CFRs for the generosity of time and sharing their gifts and talents with our parish last weekend. So many of you have contacted me throughout the week also thanking them and desiring to possibly send a note in gratitude, to share a grace, or to support their powerful mission. The focus and charism of the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal is to radically love and serve the materially poor, most especially the destitute and homeless. Each Friar leads a life of prayer, fraternal community, and assists in the proclamation of the Gospel, but they are also personally and directly involved in hands-on work with the poor. Fr. Stephen said the Friars would welcome a note of encouragement or thanks if they particularly moved you by the Divine Mercy experience this past weekend, at the mass, in adoration or personal prayer, or during the Sacrament. 

Senior Care Through the Office for the Aging



Did you know that the Nassau County Office for the Aging offers case managers for seniors? Their case management program provides the support for older adults to remain in their homes for as long as possible. They assist in providing in-home services for seniors through the Expanded In-home Services for the Elderly Program (EISEP). There are two types of in-home services offered, Level 1 which is housekeeping and chore services, and Level II which adds on personal care assistance such as bathing, dressing, toileting, grooming and feeding. For Volunteers in the Diocese of Rockville Centre

A person wishing to volunteer in any parish or organization in the Diocese of Rockville Centre must first complete three requirements:

- 1. Attend Protecting God's Children (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
- 3. Complete a background screening application.

(Background screening is conducted on all volunteers and employees every 5 years.)

Directions to Complete the 3 Requirements:

- Sign up to attend a Protecting God's Children class: <u>www.Virtus.org</u>
 When you log on to the Virtus website, you will create a Virtus account.
 - a. If you have not attended a Virtus class, you are a first time registrant.
 - The first screen will ask the name of your organization-from the drop down list select Rockville Centre-Safe Environment.
 - c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
 - d. One screen will have the Codes of Conduct. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
 - Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
 - f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.
 - 2. Background Screening Application:
 - Sterling Volunteers is the company providing the background screening.
 - b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION! If you stop-you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
 - c. You will need to provide your Social Security #; if you do not provide a Social Security # you will be charged a fee.
 - d. After completing the application, hit the 'Submit Button'

Consider Automated Giving


Automated giving provides a steady stream of support. It is a great way to manage your Sunday Offerings without the worry of missing a payment and the worry of forgetting your weekly envelope.




