Divine Mercy and the Continued Easter Joy

"Do not abandon yourselves to despair. We are the Easter people and hallelujah is our song." As a community of faith, we seem to get the whole concept of Lent - the three pillars of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. So many of you shared God's victory in those areas, and also at times you struggled in Lent 2024. It is rare that we practice Lent perfectly individually, or as a church. But as Catholics, we tend to strive for the mark better with aesthetic practices and prayer when we enter into the forty days of the desert. Then... Easter hits, and then what? Do we fall back into some of those bad habits, or allow for the distractions of work, activities, screens, and busyness to take over again?

The past 8 days (the Easter Octave) are liturgically celebrated as a continuation of Easter Sunday. At the daily Mass we read and pray over the Resurrection accounts that are so familiar, Mary Magdalen goes to the tomb, the disciples walk to Emmaus, as well as Peter and John running to the tomb, and of course today with doubting Thomas putting his hand in Jesus' side. My sisters and brothers, Easter is not just one day – in fact, we spend 50 days attempting to celebrate as if it is a single joyful feast known as the Eastertide. This is a period of fifty days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday. It's a time to remember that Jesus wasn't in a rush to ascend, but that he spent time appearing to his disciples and preparing them for Pentecost and their important mission that would follow. It is a bonus, like extra innings for us to celebrate the resurrection!

This weekend, we begin with Divine Mercy Sunday, established by Pope John Paul II in the Jubilee Year 2000 at the Mass for the Canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska. St. Faustina was a Polish nun who received visions from Jesus, including one of Jesus wearing a white garment with beams of red and white coming from His heart, which came to be known as the image of Divine Mercy. According to one of her diary entries, Jesus revealed to her that those who receive communion and attend confession on this 'Feast of Mercy' receive total forgiveness of sins. In one of her encounters with Jesus, he told her: "My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy." Divine Mercy Sunday focuses on the gift of mercy and love given through Christ's death, burial, and resurrection.

Today, we will celebrate our regularly scheduled Masses, but the 12 N Mass will be celebrated by a Franciscan Friar of the Renewal in preparation for our 3 PM Divine Mercy celebration. At the 3 PM service, there will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, a Divine Mercy preached reflection, confessions, charismatic prayer, and praise and worship music led by the CFR Friars. The Easter journey of transformation and renewal continues for us individually and as a parish as we move towards the Ascension and Pentecost.

As we cooperate with God's grace, and strive for holiness, we recognize that in our humanity, we still stumble and fall. We are sinners in need of a savior and redemption – we are in need of Divine Mercy. The Lord desires to offer it once again this weekend. Perhaps you were able to participate in our "Mercy Monday" confession marathon, or perhaps you regularly come in the morning to confession and adoration, or maybe it has been many years since you have come to confession. I encourage you to experience God's reckless pursuit of you and I, to restore us to our original innocence. The world continues to invite us to numb the parts of us that are broken and hurting, with temporary fixes and medications. Jesus invites us into the suffering and sacrifice of the cross, which is the only way to a full, transforming healing. If you carry the burdens of life, the burdens of sin, then please join us Sunday afternoon, through the great gift of the community of the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal. These joyful friars who love the Lord, and love to serve the poor, both spiritual and temporal, will share their gifts and talents, and help to bring our parish community joyfully closer to the Lord. Closer to His Divine Mercy!


