In the scriptures this weekend, Jesus says "when I was with them, I protected them in your name those you gave me, and I guarded them". I think about the great gift when God entrusts children into a family. I have been so blessed to hear from my own mother and so many of you who have the understanding and perspective that children simply are a gift from God; temporarily entrusted into your hands in order to be returned at some point and given back to God. I believe that Our Lady understood that more than most - that Jesus had a mission on this earth and that mission was guided completely by God. She was called to guide, guard, and protect the Lord, but also allow Him to grow and develop to embrace His mission and vocation.

Once again, we acknowledge May as a time to rejoice over motherhood and to look at Our Lady and how she lived that vocation to the fullest. At her deepest identity, Mary's greatest role was bringing Christ into the world. Well, that is the vocation for all of us believers – to make Jesus come alive in the world in how we live and love. That has been evident over the past few weeks as families have come to celebrate First Holy Communions. The sacrament has allowed for so many families to gather with great joy, to remember and to strengthen their own faith, and to believe and hope in these children. When the children enter into the church we see them as vessels of holiness, prepared to bring Christ into the world. To become what they receive - to be Jesus. Our Lady pioneered that path.







May 2024 has been an opportunity for us as a parish to lift up and honor Mary, the Mother of God. What an incredible gift and challenge to be entrusted with bringing the Lord into the world, and then to nurture and raise Him. To so many of you ladies out there who have been so tender and caring for us in the rectory because of your kind words, smiles, affirming emails and messages, and of course the delicious food creations you have dropped off, thank you. You have blessed us. To all the ladies on the St. William the Abbot parish and school teams who have patiently guided, counseled, and cared for me and the priests who serve here in the model and example of Our Lady, again, we thank you. And, of course, to my own mother: thank you for your witness and example of faith and strength and how you lived your vocation in caring for dad. I would not be the man and priest I am without your love and encouragement in my life. I love you.

Vet Fest May 18tb - Farmingdale


