## "This Is My Commandment - Love One Another as I Love You"

Jesus is once again crystal clear in the scriptures this weekend, not offering a suggestion, but a commandment, a mandate, a clear guideline. He instructs us to 'love one another as he has loved us;' we only need to look at the cross and his humble witness of sacrificial love to understand what he means. In the past few years, we have seen the ups and downs and the effects of the global pandemic within our society, our family, and ourselves. There have been moments where we have seen extreme selfishness, self-absorption, and the lack of the most basic awareness of others. At times it was almost the exact opposite of what Jesus asked and the mantra - "it's my world and you live in it" has reigned in the hearts of many at times. It certainly does not help when our media coverage exploits those moments as well in movies, TV shows, and the nightly news. That sentiment is finding its way in the global, local, and political ideologies which focus more on the "self-centered" as opposed to "other-centered." Jesus, our King, our leader, and our example says that we as Catholics must live differently.

Although the darkness of sin and confusion can show itself, if we look deeper we can see the glimmer of hope that our world has to offer. I certainly experienced that most recently from so many of you who expressed and extended the love of God to my family and I at the tragic loss of my cousin Ed Boden. His sudden death has been both terrible and beautiful for all those who knew and loved him. To be the pastor at St. William the Abbot is an incredible privilege and a great honor and gift for me. As the shepherd and spiritual guide of our parish, I too face the human experiences of joy and sorrow and triumph and tragedy that any Christian disciple might face. The beauty of this role entrusted to me is how I most recently experienced the powerful love of God through so many of you who extended your condolences to me personally, to my aunt, to Eddie's wife and sons, to his siblings, and the other members of our family and his lifelong Seaford friends. Thank you for that expression of tenderness and care. In the moments of confusion, disappointment, and even doubt, God has a way of piercing through in the way others love us.

I would like to share a particular experience of that subtle and powerful way God reveals himself. I have witnessed a number of fascinating sights on Jackson Avenue in front of the church and the school through these past five years. We have had beautiful sacramental moments of weddings, communions, and graduations. Unfortunately, we have also seen reckless driving, careless litter bugs, and shall I say a few "interesting characters" walking from the Seaford train station into our neighborhoods. At the funeral last week, there was one of those "restore your hope in the future" moments at the very end of the liturgy. My cousin Ed was a Navy submarine veteran, who so bravely protected our country and freedoms in a time when we were still in the Cold War with Russia and the beginning of the conflict in the Middle East. Very often at the end of a veteran's funeral, there is a presentation of the American flag to the family. It is powerful to experience live and in person. Someone at the funeral took a picture during that beautiful ceremony and, in the background, you could see one of the classes from St. William the Abbot School standing at attention. The class was on its way to a field trip, but they paused to pray in honor, reverence, and in a show of respect for the deceased and his family.

If you are like me, there may be times when you can be somewhat concerned and disappointed by the challenges that we see in the world and for our future. Sometimes I wonder about my nieces, nephews, and godchildren as well as what is in store for your children and grandchildren. What will the world be like for them? What is so beautiful about our scripture verse today is that if we follow the commandment that Jesus puts forth, to love one another as he has loved us, then our world will change for the better. I think about the impact of those young children who stood at attention during the funeral. They did so because they are being formed at an early age by their teachers, our principal, and of course, their parents. Division, hate, racism, and discrimination does not develop in our genes, our heart, and our mind - they are learned. I am so grateful for Mrs. Abbate's 3rd Grade class, who to the best of their ability, are living that commandment that Jesus has put forth to us. They are learning how to live and love like Jesus. It encourages me and it challenges me, to do the same.



In this month of May, a month dedicated to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary, the woman who formed, taught, and guided our Lord Jesus from an early age within the Holy Family, let us ask for her intercession upon our parish, our families, and our children. Let us pray for the grace to live and love one another as Jesus did!






Each flag comes with a ribbon that can be personalized to bonor a specific Veteran

The program provides significant economic relief to qualifying households by providing rental arrears or temporary rental assistance. Eligible residents must show evidence of imminent homelessness and show that their inability to pay was the result of a sudden reduction of income or other unexpected circumstances. ## Background Screening Update The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People:

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (The Charter) promulgated by the Bishops of the United States in 2002 outlines specific practices and guidelines providing standards of safety in parishes and dioceses throughout the United States. As directed in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all employees, clergy, and volunteers to complete three requirements within thirty days of employment or volunteering:

- 1. Attend Protecting God's Children Program (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct;
- Complete a background screen application. The Diocese requires all those who remain in active ministry be rescreened at 5 yr. intervals. volunteers/employees.

#### A Word on Background Screening of Volunteers:

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People (OFPCYP) has streamlined the volunteer application process enabling volunteers to complete the three safe environment requirements in one step. Individuals wishing to volunteer in a parish or school:

- Register to attend a Protecting God's Children class and create a Virtus account on the Virtus website: www.Virtus.org
- Electronically acknowledge the Diocesan Code of Conduct- provided during the Virtus registration process.
- Follow the instructions to complete the Sterling Volunteers background screening application background offered during the Virtus registration process.

#### **Active Volunteers:**


If you are active in a parish ministry, have already attended Virtus and have been background screened you may be at – or beyond- the *5yr. rescreening requirement*. If this is the case, you will receive an email from *Sterling Volunteers* asking you to complete the background screening application on-line. You may access the background screening application by following the prompt in the email or logging into your Virtus account. *Please be aware-this is not a scam nor has your e-mail been hacked.* The OFPCYP has been working with your parish to update the Safe Environment records and noted it is time for you to be rescreened. You may also be prompted to electronically resign the Code of Conduct when you log into your Virtus account.





On the left side of your screen in the green column click "Update My Account" You will be able to make the necessary changes-please remember to hit the SAVE button at the bottom of the screen.
