Fuju	Sept. – Oct.	Granny Smith	Medium Size. Reddish Green Skin. High Quality, Crisp, Juicy
Gala	Sept.	Granny Smith	Med. Size. Cone/Round Shape. Golden Yellow Skin with Red/Orange Blush. Semi-sweet. Crisp
Granny Smith	Aug. – Sept.	Gala	Very large fruit with bright green color. Firm, sweet/tart flesh That is excellent for eating, pies, & sauce.
Golden Delicious	Late Sept.	Self Pollinating	Golden Apple - Sweet & Juicy Excellent for Baking, Pies, Salads
Red Delicious	Late Sept.	Golden Delicious	Huge Crops. Red Skin, Crisp Sweet Flavor Great for Fresh Eating.

Moorpark	July – August	Self Pollinating	Large golden/yellow Fruit – Great for Fresh Eating, Canning, Drying

Surecrop	August	Self Pollinating	Colorful, firm flesh great for eating fresh, or canning. Cold hardy -20

Ayers	July-Aug.	Moonglow	Medium Size. Yellow skin with red blush. Flesh is smooth with a Very sweet Flavor. Low in grit. Good: Fresh eating or canning.
Kieffer	Sept.-Oct.	Moonglow	Med.-Lg. Fruit. Gritty texture – perfect for canning & cooking.
Moonglow	August	Excellent Pollinator	Large, Brownish green skin with mild, juicy flesh/little grit.
Orient	Sept – Oct.	Kieffer/Moonglow	Yellow, mild pear with juicy flesh. Fresh eaten, or canned.
20 th Century (Asian)	August	Self Pollinated	Juicy, sweet, mild flavored, Crisp like an apple. Keeps well.

Ranger	June/July	Self Pollinating	Large, bright red-skin – sweet, yellow flesh. Freestone
Red Haven	July	Self Pollinating	Round, medium-large peach. Deeply blushed Freestone with a firm, Sweet, yellow flesh. Fresh Eating, Desserts, Canning, Freezing.
Belle of Georgia	August	Self Pollinating	Large, Freestone with White Flesh an intensely sweet flavor. Great for Fresh eating, canning, preserves.

Harvester	July	Self Pollinating	Medium-large size Freestone with high quality yellow skin & flesh. Good: Canning, Baking, Preserving, Fresh Eating
Sentinel	June	Self Pollinating	Popular with home gardeners. Freestone with Yellow/Red blush Skin. Great for Eating Fresh, Desserts, Canning.
Loring	July	Self Pollinating	Large - Exceptionally sweet yellow fleshed Freestone peach. Consistent heavy producer. Canning, Baking, Fresh Eating.

Morris	Mid July	Methley, Santa Rosa	Large Red Fruit, with Red, Sweet juicy flesh. Eating Fresh, Cooking

Texas Everbearing	June - July	Self Pollinating	Med – Large Fig, with bronze tinged violet skin & rosy amber pulp. Rich & sweet flavor – Nearly Seedless Preserves, Eating Fresh. Very heavy producer. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cold Hardy 0 – 10 Degrees
Blue Giant	June – July	Self Pollinating	A huge Fig with attractive purple skin and delicious amber flesh. Very Sweet with an ever bearing habit. Drying, Canning, Preserves Fresh Eating. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cold Hardy 0 – 10 Degrees
Little Miss Figgy	June – July	Self Pollinating	Miniature Fig, with spectacular dark purple fruits Perfect for Landscapes & Containers. 4-6' Tall x 3-4' Wide <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cold Hardy 0-10 Degrees

Variety	Height	Harvest	Description
BLACKBERRIES			
Brazo / Staked	4-6'	May	Erect bush with thorns. High yields of large berries. Acid-flavored fruit is recommended for cooking rather than eating.
Apraphaho (Thornless)	4-5'	Early May	Thornless berry with large, firm fruit & small seeds. Earliest ripening of all varieties. Self Pollinating, but benefits from A pollinator.
Apache (Thornless)	5-8'	Jun – July	vigorous & disease resistant. High yields, Large fruit. Excellent for Jams, Jellies & Pies. Self- Pollinating, but benefits from a Pollinator.
Prime-Ark (Thornless)	3-4'	July – Frost	Produces on First Year Canes, followed by a second crop on older Canes. Large, firm & sweet fruit. Excellent for Home.
BLUEBERRIES - Best Yields when 3 Varieties Planted Soil Acidity 4.5 – 5.5 - Plant with Azalea Mix			
Premier	6-8'	April / May	Medium Sized Berry with very Flavorful Berry. Well Adapted to Hot, Humid Summers
Climax	8'	May – July	Blue, Green Foliage, with very Flavorful blue berries. Great for Large Containers. Fresh Eating, Cooking, Freezing, Preserves.
Tif Blue	8-10'	July	Large, Light Blue Berries, with great flavor. Cold Hardy.
Pink Lemonade	4-5'	July – Aug.	Delicious, Berries, that matures to a bright pink color. Show pink Flowers in spring, and gold/orange fall foliage.
RED RASPBERRIES			
Heritage	4-6'	July	Vigorous, Everbearing plant. Produces medium, large sweet Dark R Firm berries. Fresh eating, desserts, jellies, Preserves. Tolerates heat and humidity.
DEWBERRIES			
Austin Dewberries	5-8'	May – July	Close relative of the blackberry that offers large, plentiful fruit That can be eaten fresh, or used to make cobbler, jam, pies.
ELDERBERRIES			
		Mid Aug – Mid Sept.	Blue Black Fruit that is Tart. Used for Wines, Juices, Jellies, & Jams
