

Fig. 3. Painting of the *Royal William* (1719). It is the earliest known painting of an Admiralty Board ship model.




Fig. 4. Miniature of the *St. George* (1701) of about 10" length by the famed modeler, **Donald McNarry.**

Around 2,000 sailors were lost in the disaster leading Parliament to pass the **Longitude Act** (1714) offering a prize to anyone who could establish a reliable method for finding longitude at sea.




Fig.15. Cover of the Kriegsteins' book on their collection.
