Keep engaging our passion for the A's and I'll see you soon. Thanks! Your president,



Eight 1930 - 31 Model A car owners drove their prize vintage vehicles on the two hour trip from Kansas City to Jamesport. Some members of the twenty-five member group choose to drive their air-conditioned newer model cars to town so they wouldn't have to battle the heat which was in the upper 90's during the alternoon.

One of the drivers stated that they took Highway 69 and traveled at a speed of about 45 - 50 mph on the trip; although they would probably travel I-35 on their return trip home.

They reported they were having a good time while here and dined at one of the local restaurants for their noon meal and enjoyed the day shopping.

George and Betty Rifford

George's introduction and interest in automobiles started at a very young age from his father, George Jr. GHis father loved automobiles, and how they worked. He was always concerned with the proper maintenance of the automobile. He taught George at a very young age every part of the automobile, and would quiz him to make sure he knew and understood its function. He taught George the importance of maintenance and how to maintain the automobile.

At about this time or shortly thereafter there were two teenage boys who lived across the street from George's family. Mainly one, Doug "Goose" Smiley also had a love for automobiles. Doug was restoring a 1929 Model A Tudor at the time and George was helping Doug whenever he could. This family with the two young teenagers whose Mother also happened to be George's 4th grade teacher looked after George and treated him as one of their family or a younger brother. George adapted very well since he came from a family of siblings being two sisters. Doug "Goose" loved working on automobiles, and George was always his helper, go-for, hold this while he would tighten something. Once in awhile the two brothers would look at each other, look at George, nod, grab him and take him in the house upside down and give him what they called 'A Swirlie'. Also being an ornery youngster, George would sometimes sneak, or happen to quietly walk into the basement where "Goose" and his girlfriend were, back then it was called "necking". They caught him and they grabbed him, put on lots of red lipstick and kissed him all over his face. He went running home, down the stairs to his room. When he streaked through the house his Mother, who saw the red and thought he had been in a fight or accident, came running downstairs to see the lipstick which was an extra embarrassment to George.

As George grew older his love for automobiles was still there and he then was actually helping along with learning the techniques to changing the body style, restoration of the automobile. In High School George and a buddy restored a 1923 T Roadster. They restored it not to original but to catch the eyes of girls. This is the story he tells of how they used a 16 gallon beer keg for a gas tank. It was a cool car! They called it their "chick wagon".

Then George grew up.....His real yearning was to own a Model A. In 1998-99 when Betty started working at Huhtamaki Packaging Company (Sealright Packaging) in De Soto, Kansas. One day when George came out to De Soto to take Betty to lunch, they were driving through the small town of De Soto and saw this building that had a sign 'Grandpa's Garage' and looking through the windows they could see numerous antique automobiles. They ventured, turned the door knob and walked inside. A very nice gentleman by the name of Dean Weller came out to say hello and talked with them and showed them all of the antiques he had either built or restored. His kindness and meticulous restoration never left George's mind. He would venture over to talk to Dean many times after that. On that first day and times after George saw this one automobile that he fell in love with and kept telling Betty that he wanted to own one just like that one. Finally one day, Betty told him to ask Mr. Weller if he would like to sell it. So George ventured over to De Soto and when he finally asked Dean about it, he had sold it. George was so disappointed, as he had his eye on that one automobile for over a year. Dean asked George if he was seriously thinking of buying one like the 1931 Model A Roadster Deluxe he had and of course his response was YES. Dean happened to have a friend who had one for sale and gave George the name and number of Don Tallman. George promised Betty he was only going to go over and look at it. Yeah Right! George went over first and then we both went to look at it. It was love at first sight and it was the very same 1931 Roadster Dean had restored.

We really enjoy our 1931 and our two little Granddaughters, Paige (7) and Hailey (3) love to go riding in it. When it is announced we are going to go for a ride in the Model A, they associate going for a ride with going to Silas and Maddy's Ice Cream in Olathe. They even ask Grandpa to go for a ride. We have had so much fun taking it out for a ride. Young or old, it brings a smile to everyone's face, a honk, a wave or a thumbs up. A great conversation starter at the Ice Cream store, Gas Pump and the Valvoline Oil Change shop. The Valvoline Shop does not charge George for changing the oil. They say it is privilege to change the oil on a vehicle that age.

We haven't made to very many of the club meetings or outings, but we do cherish the friendships we have made with the club and enjoy all of the members.

MAFFI Minute

Through the generosity of Donna Lewis, former MAFCA President and MAFFI Trustee, "Betsy", a 1930 Ford Model A has been donated to help raise funds for the expansion of the beloved Model A Ford Museum. The car remains in the same condition as restored by Red Grow in the 1950's. Enjoy driving "Betsy", your newest Model A, to your next cruise-in or car show. This is a truly historical vehicle, once owned by a MAFFI Hall of Fame inductee.

"Betsy", became famous as the best Model A in the world. The Ford Model A has gathered 32 top place trophies in the 34 shows which the car was entered. That includes two national shows in 1957 and 1962. Overall, the car won 39 trophies. It is said that Red Grow's car, "Betsy", was an inspiration at the time. It drove many people to do their best in restoring their own car. This urge to do the best restoration possible, developed the need for more information about how to a better job. As a result, the Judging Standards evolved. We can thank Red Grow and the MAFCA founders for their vision.

In 1967, Red sold "Betsy" to a Ford car dealer named Dave Grubbs for \$5,000, an unheard-of price in those days. As a result, Dave Grubb placed the car in a glass cage centered in his dealer showroom. 




