If you have ideas for tours or places to see Please let me know.





MODEL A'S I HAVE OWNED

I grew up in Oskaloosa, KS, graduated in 1947. At that time new 46 and 47 model cars were around in increasing numbers but there were still a lot of pre-war cars on the road including Model A's.

My first Model A was a 1929 coupe that I bought from a farmer for \$35.00 in 1945. This car had been setting under a tree for a while. It did not run, it needed tires which were rationed, and the body was starting to get surface rust. The interior must have been serviceable as I don't remember doing anything to it. I overhauled the engine in "Shop Class" at school. I painted the car with a brush, bought new Wards tires the first day after the war rationing stopped. This A was a very dependable car for high school.

I became interested in old cars in 1961 during the centennial year Of Kansas statehood. During 1961 there were many parades and pageants. There was a parade in Ottawa that summer with a lot of old cars. After watching the parade I knew I wanted to get in the old car hobby.

The second Model A I owned was a 1931 Tudor bought in the fall of 1961 in Lawrence. The price was \$90.00 and had to be towed home. All it needed to run was a battery and clean the gas tank. Neighbor kids had put tree buds in the gas tank. After getting two fenders straightened, a different manifold and some cosmetic work, the A made a serviceable family collector car. My A wasn't as nice as most of the other cars in the Lawrence Antique Car Club, so I decided to sell it and use the money to fix up a 1929 Studebaker which I still have.

I learned of the Model A movement and The Plain Ol' A's through Dean Weller. I was getting interested in Model A's and visited the club a few times when I heard of the upcoming Alaska Trip for A's. Glenna and I decided the trip was something we would like to do but the big problem was we didn't have a car. We started looking and bought a 1931 Model 160B Town Sedan in Sept. 1987 from Warren McWilliams of Harrisonville, MO. This was a restored car and all it needed was some minor things done to it. Probably the biggest job was to put in adjustable valve lifters. The plan was to sell this car after we drove it to Alaska in 1988. We did make the Alaska trip with very little trouble and decided to keep the car after we got home. Alternator / regulator problems and 3 inner tubes were the biggest problems plus the usual overheating, ignition, and carburetor problems.

The Model A is the first car I think of when I want to drive an antique car. I keep it ready to run year around. I could use it in an emergency for a second car if necessary. Good lights, good brakes, and turn signals make it easy to drive in town. I like being around Model A's and Model A people. Needless to say, I plan to be in The Plain Ol A's and the Model A hobby for a long time.


