Webmaster-Joe is working on the vendor list.


<u>Christmas Party</u>-The room has been reserved for the next Christmas party.

## Valentine's Day Cards

According to Hallmark, approximately 145 million Valentine's Day cards are exchanged industry-wide (not including packaged kids' valentines for classroom exchanges), making Valentine's Day the second-largest holiday for giving greetings cards.

In addition to the United States, Valentine's Day is celebrated in Canada, Mexico, the United Kingdom, France Australia, Denmark and Italy.

Hallmark founder J.C. Hall began selling Valentine's Day postcards in 1910.

As postcards declined in popularity, Hallmark added greeting cards to its line in 1912. Valentines were added to the company's inventory in 1913.

Hallmark began printing its own greeting card designs in 1915. The company's first Valentine's Day cards appeared on store shelves in 1916.

Hallmark's first greeting cards in 1915 were printed text and line images made from steel die engravings. A hand-fed press would produce between 500-700 cards per hour. The images were then hand-painted, with each artist adding a color.

Silk-screen and airbrush techniques were later added. (From the Hallmark Corp. Website)

## Jim's Tech Tips "Preventing Problems with the Starter Switch Rod"

The Starter Switch Rod passes through the firewall and screws into the Starter Switch. You step on the head of the rod to start the car.

You will find that today's reproduction rods screw quite easily into and out of the switch. This can be nice when you are assembling things.

But I have found on more than just a few cars the engine vibration can cause the rod to unscrew itself and back out of the switch. You hit a bump and the rod drops down and makes contact with the post on the starter switch, where the battery cable connects.



the starter switch, where the battery cable connects. Yikes! That's a direct short to ground, with a LOT of amps behind it.

So you want to make the rod a bit harder to turn when installing it in the switch. Add a small drop of blue thread locker to the rod before you screw it in, or gently tap the threads a little with a hammer to deform them and make them harder to screw in and out.

Another simple solution, if you are not doing a car for Fine Point Judging (because it is not how the switch was originally done), is to add a 5/16" nut to the threaded end of the rod before screwing it into the switch. When you have the rod where you want it (desired button height inside the car, etc.) use that nut as a jam nut and lock the rod to the switch. It will not back out while driving, but you can easily undo it when you need to take it apart.

Whichever approach you choose, you will have have more trouble-free miles if you get ahead of this potential problem. Until next time...


