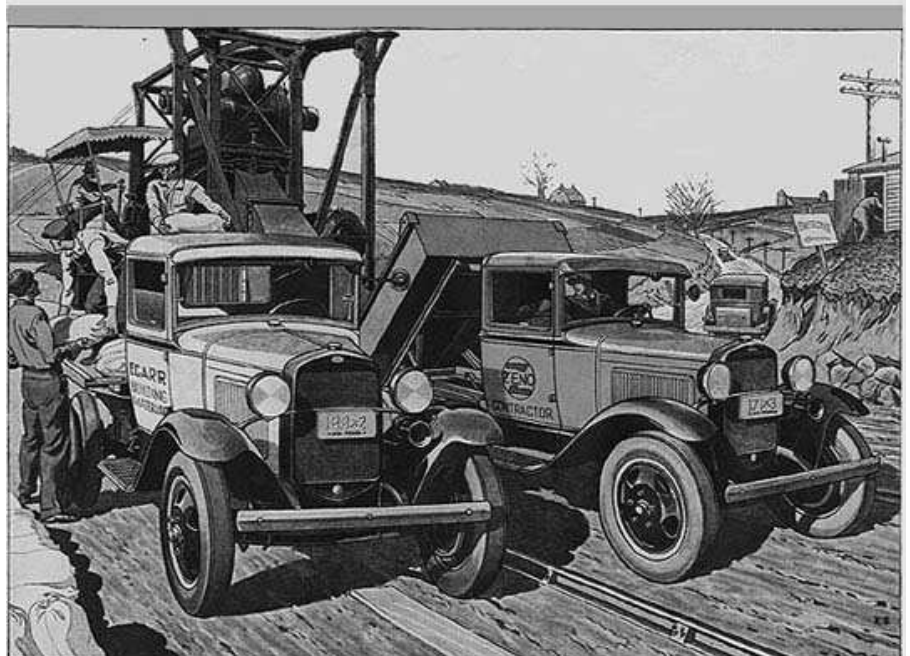

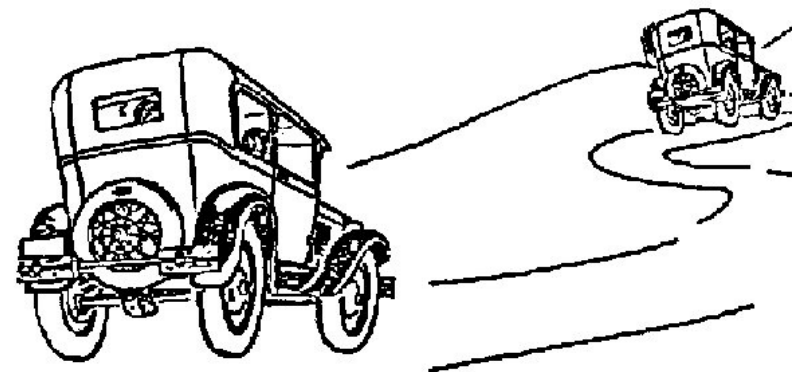

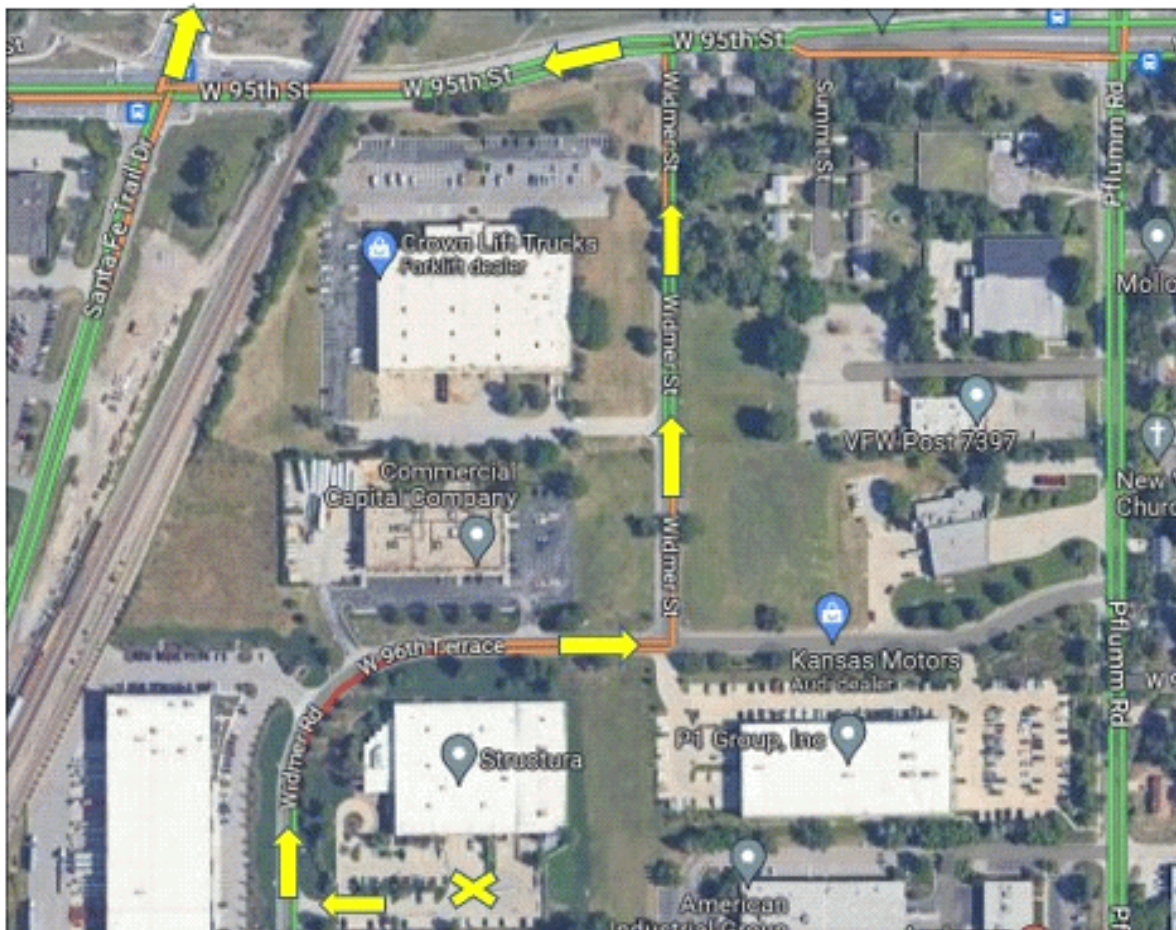
July 4th Parade - Changes to Set up Location

We will be going to the Structura parking lot at 9365 Widmer St. for our group's staging. We will line up between 9:00 and 9:45 at the Structura parking lot. The parade starts at 10:00. Bill Hills will have a sign-up sheet at the next meeting. As always we will be going to Zarda BBQ for lunch.

To get to the staging area, we are suggesting Pflumm to 96th Terr and go west. The picture shows an aerial photo of the area. The easiest access is from the East and South. 95th Street will be closed.

The arrows show the route to enter the parade staging area from Structura. (take Pflumm south to W. 96th Ter). Parade staff will be at 96th Ter and Widmer and will direct your vehicles to continue on 96th Ter., following the curve to the Structura parking lot. After we get into formation at Structura, we will then return to 96th Ter and Widmer. Parade staff will stop traffic at that entry point to allow our group to proceed north on Widmer to 95th Street. Our group will turn west onto 95th Street and proceed until you get to your lineup spot. The yellow highlights on the attached aerial shows the staging area for the parade as well as the location of Structura.

Reminder: Pflumm north of 95th Street will be closed for the Freedom Run and Parade, so vehicles entering the staging area will have to enter from the east or south.

Model A Youth Day In Kansas City

When MAFCA announced May as Model A Youth month I thought the Plain Ol' A's should do something. The first thing I needed to do was get the club on board- which they were. Now I needed to come up with a plan. The next thing I did was contact Chuck Lewis with the Heart of America Club to see if they would like to join us and they did.

So Chuck and I got together to discuss what youth group we wanted to invite. We discussed high school auto programs, Boy Scout troops, and Touch-a-Truck events. We decided to check with the Boy Scouts so I contacted Andy Dugan, who is a POA member and is involved with his son's Scout troop. Andy thought we could do some training with the Scouts on their Automotive Merit Badge and sent me the Merit Badge requirements. Andy thought he could come up with around 10 Scouts that needed to work on this merit badge. I also contacted my grandson's troop leader. I met with Derek Smith, Troop 387 Scout Leader. After discussing what we had in mind Mr. Smith said he thought he could come up with 20- 25 Scouts to work on their merit badge. Mr. Smith also asked me to come and talk at one of their Scout meetings which I was glad to do.

Now we have a group for the youth day. The next thing to do is find a place to hold it. Chuck suggested we contact Lance Burton, an HOA and POA member, to see if he would let us hold the event at his house. Lance thought it was a great idea and agree to host the event. The only Saturday Lance had open was May 13th. So we decide to hold the event from 10:- 3:00 on that day.

Next came figuring out what we would do for the day. We decided I would bring my roadster chassis to use as a training aid, we would give car rides in the Model A's, have a Hubley Derby, and provide lunch. We decided we would have hotdogs, chips and cookies for lunch. Andy said he would check with QuikTrip to see if they would donate the hotdogs and buns and they did.

I went to speak with the Scout troop on May 1st. I thought I would be going on items on the merit badge requirements but Mr. Smith wanted me to tell to Scouts about my 42-year career in Fleet Maintenance. The Scouts had a lot of questions. Mr. Smith said he had 23 Scouts interested in coming out on May 13th but he had to check with their parents to see if the parents wanted to take them out to Lance's house in Raymore, MO. We ended up with 13 Scouts and 11 parents.

On May 13th we used my roadster chassis to go over the Automotive Merit Badge requirements. The Scouts got a lot out of seeing all the items under a car that they don't see every day. Again they had a lot of questions. After going over the merit badge requirements we loaded up the cars and took the Scouts for a ride around the neighborhood. When we got back we had lunch. Now it was time for the Hubley Derby. We had a few cars to run down the track- not all Hubley's. The Scouts really got into it.

I want to thank Lance and all who helped make this first Kansas City Youth Day go so well.

WOW!! What a beauty. That is one of the expressions we hear about our pride and joy, a beautiful Riviera Blue 1928 Roadster with Cream wheels.

We acquired her by being in the right place at the right time. While on a business trip to Nevada, Mo. in August of 1982 I saw a snazzy red Model A Pickup drive by. I asked about it and was told it belonged to the owner of the Country Kitchen Restaurant. I went there for lunch and while talking told him I was looking for a Roadster. He told me of a friend, Ray Tracy, near Des Moines who rebuilt A' engines and did other work on A's. I called Ray from the restaurant. He told me of a Roadster in a nearby town that he had worked on for 30 years that was for sale. He described the car. I told him if it was as he said I would take it. It was and I did.

We drove the car on nice days until April when I started disassembling it. My Father had been a Ford mechanic in his early years and went to work for a Lincoln - Ford dealership in Denver in early 1928. He knew everything about Model A's even after all those years and was much help when I ran into trouble. I now have the Snap-On Tool Box he bought new in May 1928 along with many of his tools. Our family owned a 29 Tudor for some time and a friend and I bought a 1930 Tudor in 1944 while seniors in High School and drove it until we received our orders to report to the service later that year.

While looking for someone to answer my questions, I was told to call John Hargrave. He was very generous with his time and we had many long conversations over several months. I have always appreciated the help and encouragement he gave me even though we had not met.

The restoration of the chassis from frame up went along nicely. The engine was rebuilt in Holiday, MO and on January 7, 1984 the engine was started for the first time. **That was a thrill.** Ralph Haggard of the Heart of America club did the body work and painting. On Thanksgiving day of 1984 the car was complete with the exception of the top. By early spring the top was installed and we were ready to go.

Our first "show" was the Shrine Car Meeting at Blue Ridge Mall. It was also the first "long" trip on the Interstate. That wasn't a thrill. Since that time we have been in lots of parades and on lots of tours, including a trip to Breckenridge, Co. in 1989. We made it up Pikes Peak in 1991. Another thrill. We are heading for Texas in June for the MAFCA National Convention and are looking forward to seeing 800 or so Model A's in one place. It will also be a pleasure to attend the National to support John Hargrave as President of MAFCA.

Brittoy was restored mostly original but since that time some changes have been made, such as a 'Don Lobner' balanced engine and super water pump and an overdrive. All of these changes have added to the pleasure of driving her.

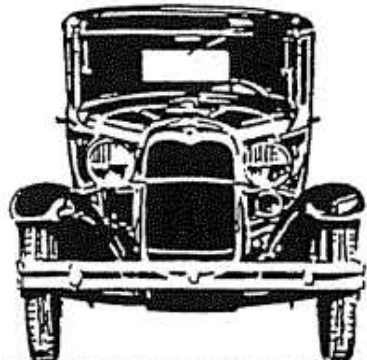
