As I was thinking how to begin this article the word historical came to me. Am I a historical figure? Well maybe not to the world, but my involvement in the Ministry to Catholic Charismatic Renewal (MCCR) in the Diocese of Toledo has provided many historical moments.

My husband Denny and I heard about the Baptism of the Holy Spirit in 1972 and started searching for someone to tell us more about it. We soon found a 7-week

course on the Baptism of the Holy Spirit at St John the Baptist in Point Place, Toledo. It was an incredible experience! We found out all we had to do is ask the Holy Spirit in, and He came with His graces and gifts.

a large gathering in Ann Arbor, Michigan, where there was Praise and Worship, speaking in tongues, dynamic preaching and healing. As I was singing with those around me I thought, "As they began singing in tongues, nobody is paying attention to me, I won't be embarrassed - I am going to try to sing in tongues." After a few tries of ba, ba, la, la, etc. More words came out of those syllables and I was singing in tongues. What a marvelous gift! Our Lord tells us to "pray always" and we can when we pray in tongues.

I had an experience of praying in tongues even while teaching. I was a teacher and substitute teacher for many years. One day while substituting in an elementary class, a little boy was misbehaving. While I was having a reading lesson with a small group of kids, he sat next to me. I knew Jesus loved him and wanted to give him peace, so I put my hand on his shoulder. In my mind, I prayed for him

in tongues - while I was also teaching them all the reading lesson. Impossible you say - "All things are possible with God." He settled down for the rest of the day. Praise be to the Holy Spirit!

There were many signs and wonders through the years, even continuing today. The Holy Spirit continues to Bless us with His Gifts and desires us to use them to bring others to Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Remember He came on Pentecost to found the church. If you have been Baptized in the Holy Spirit, but have not been using His Gifts - invite Him into your heart to renew you in His Gifts. If you haven't been Baptized in the Holy Spirit, come to a prayer group or a Night of Healing service and open yourself up to Him. Thank God for the Holy Spirit who comes to empower us. bring about life giving efforts.

So "Revival' is a Divine visitation, a sovereign work of God – in answer to sincere, prevailing prayer.

Through this Revival God will

- grip his people with a deep conviction, repentance, forgiveness, and deliverance from personal sins.
- fill His people with the Holy Spirit and manifest through them the fruit and graces of the Holy Spirit.
- fill the Church and community with His presence and power.
- cause non-Christians to earnestly seek Him.
- ignite in His people, young and old, a passion to bring the lost to Christ at home and around the world.

This REVIVAL is a call for each one of us to reflect on our own heart and life concerning our faith practice and zeal for the REAL PRESENCE of the Lord in the Eucharist. After we have done that, we can pray for and encourage members of our families, especially those who have drifted away from practicing their faith and from the Lord's Table of Eucharist.

In the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John, Jesus talks about the importance of eating His flesh and drinking His blood and many of His disciples say, "This is hard, who can accept it?" The text continues, "As a result of this, many of His disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied Him." Today, many baptized Catholics are no longer receiving Christ in Holy Communion. Some 80% no longer practice their faith, thus the reason for the Eucharistic Revival movement.

Jesus says to them: "It is the Spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail. The words I have spoken are Spirit and life."

Later He says: "I have much more to tell you, but you

cannot bear it now. But when He comes, the Spirit of Truth, He will guide you to all truth...He will glorify me, because He will take from what is Mine and declare it to you." It is the Holy Spirit who makes Jesus alive for us personally and who makes all gifts of Jesus alive for us, especially the Eucharist.

During the Eucharistic Prayer, the 'Epiclesis' invoking the Holy Spirit is prayed: "O Lord, we humbly implore You by the same Spirit graciously make holy these gifts we have brought to You for consecration, that they become the Body and Blood of Your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, at whose command we celebrate these mysteries." As we call on the Holy Spirit for the gifts to be transformed into the Body and Blood of Jesus, in a similar fashion, all those who receive Holy Communion can be encouraged to call on the Holy Spirit before receiving Holy Communion so that the Spirit may bring them full awareness and experience of what we are receiving: Jesus Himself – Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. There is also a secondary "epiclesis" regarding us: "...grant that we who are nourished by the Body and Blood of your Son and filled with the Holy Spirit, may become one body, one spirit in Christ."

Again the Eucharistic REVIVAL goes hand in hand with the Charismatic Renewal, which Pope Francis calls, "a current of grace for the whole Church." Therefore, just like an appliance or automobile cannot function without electrical current, so Christians cannot function properly without the CURRENT of the Holy Spirit flowing through them.

So we, as ministers of the Holy Spirit, have a wonderful opportunity to witness to the truth of the Eucharistic Revival in our homes and in our parishes by living in the influence of our Lord's Spirit.
