Cliff's Notes

The story of Jesus' appearance on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24: 13-35) is so instructive for us to consider. Occurring on that first Easter evening, the Resurrected Lord draws near to two of his followers, but they do not recognize him. It is clear that they are aware of everything that has happened in the past few

days. They even knew that some women came upon the empty tomb that morning and were told that Jesus was not dead, but was alive! Yet, these disciples did not recognize the Risen Lord who was standing next to them.

Is this not the story of the modern church? We have waved our palms on Palm Sunday. We have shared in the Sacrament around the table and then stood silently as we heard of the Crucifixion of Jesus. We also reaffirmed that Christ is Risen Indeed! But now that Easter is over, do we just move on with our lives?

Yet, the proclamation that Christ is Risen is as true today as it was on the day Jesus rose from death. I believe that our Risen Savior continues to walk alongside of us, but are we aware of that?

It is often in hindsight when we realize that we have not been alone in our lives, but that God was there to give us the courage and insight to get through whatever life throws in our path. Many call them "God Moments" when we are aware of the Spirit of God walking alongside us.

After Easter I encourage you to continue to attend worship; support the church; and to sharpen your spiritual awareness. Know that you have not been left alone. Be grateful and appreciative that God's Spirit has been with you. For the truth of Easter is that Christ is Risen and that He will be with us for all time and in all places.

Have a Blessed April; May the Presence of the Risen Savior be with you.
