



The Joyous Noise recipient for the month of July has been designated as the Belive4Linda Foundation. On September 21, 2021, Linda Agosti, wife and mother of 4, began her fight against ALS. Linda's ALS was caused by the expression of the C9orf72 gene, which she inherited from her mother. Since the C9orf72 gene is passed on dominantly, there is a 50/50 chance that each of Linda's 4 children will possess this ALS-causing gene.

Linda is a role model throughout the community spreading kindness and love to every person she meets. Her laugh and smile are contagious. The Believe 4 Linda Foundation was created to join the fight against ALS with Linda and other people living with ALS. Furthermore, the foundation aims to fund research to prevent the possibility of people inheriting the C9orf72 gene or to target preventive therapies for the ALS-causing gene.

August 2023

The Joyous Noise recipient for the month of August has been designated as Operation Kid-to-Kid, The Vacation Bible School Mission Project. A shiny new notebook, colorful pens, a rainbow box of crayons. There's something fresh and exciting about back-to-school lists. 
