

Cliff's Notes

I am writing this newsletter article the day after Ash Wednesday. It has already been a very eventful week with the Super Bowl being played on Sunday, a heavy snowstorm, which caused wide spread power outages, and an ecumenical and inspiring Ash Wednesday service. (And, it is only Thursday)

By the time you read this, it may seem like old news or even ancient history. For most of us, we will have forgotten these events and moved on. Do you even remember who won the Super Bowl? (Kansas City Chiefs).

In the same manner, I wonder if our celebrations of Lent, Good Friday, and Easter are thought of in the same way. We prepare and look forward to them, but once they are over, we move on to the next thing, possibly even forgetting any significance that they hold for us.

This is especially true of the Crucifixion of Christ. A dark day which we would rather forget. when Jesus, God's Beloved Son, suffered and died for us and for the redemption of all humanity. It is so much easier to remember and celebrate Easter, the time of Resurrection, new hope, and new life.

Yet the celebration of Easter is only the result of Christ's death. It is only natural for us to move from the sadness of death to the joy of new life. But the death of Christ is also a reminder of Christ's call for us to sacrifice our time and talents for the benefit of others. For me, one key to understanding our faith is to remember Jesus calls us to give of ourselves out of love for ourselves, our family, our church, our community, and even our world.

Remember the words of our Savior, "If anyone wants to become my followers, let them deny themselves, take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it and those who lose their lives for my sake and for the sake of the gospel will save it. (Mark 8: 34-35)

As we journey through this season of Lent moving toward Easter, let us consider these words and how they apply to our lives every day.





FROM THE CHURCH BOARD


It's been warm and then cold and then warm and then cold.....


