Pentecost is the celebration of the beginning of the Christian Church, when the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples, energizing their faith, propelling them to go out into the streets of Jerusalem to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ, Crucified, Died, and Resurrected. (Acts 2: 1-13).

This is also the Sunday when we confirm young people into the life of our congregation. It's an IMPORTANT day in the life of the church. I encourage every member to worship with us on that day.


Pentecost is the day that puts LIFE into our faith. We teach a lot about God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit as well as the many aspects of our faith. I am afraid that we make faith all about what we KNOW about God and little about how we experience or live out our faith. We know a lot about any number of celebrities, but since we never really meet them do we really get to "know" who they are and what they are like? I believe that until we understand how Our Savior has touched our individual lives, we will not fully comprehend how He has touched and affected our lives.

Pentecost is the day when Jesus is no longer a person of "history" but will become the One who walks with us, guides us, and leads us through this often confused and confusing world. The Spirit of Jesus is alive for each of us.

My prayer is that each Confirmand will feel the Spirit as they confess their faith in Jesus on May 19. I would also hope that this would be a day when each of us is able to reaffirm our vows to love and serve God in our lives through worship and sacrificial love. If we all took the Spirit of Jesus seriously, it could re-invigorate our church and each of our lives. This is not to accuse any of us of not being faithful, but too often we become complacent and are never really challenged.

May the Spirit of the Risen Savior move us to new levels of faithfulness and generosity as we open ourselves to the Spirit on *Pentecost Sunday, May 19th.*
