Observing Advent

Advent — the first season of the liturgical year — includes the four Sundays and weeks prior to December 25th. Advent dates from the fourth century, when it lasted 40 days and included fasting and solemnity, much like Lent.



Advent is from Adventus, Latin for "coming," referring to Jesus' birth in Bethlehem and also his second coming. The traditional colors of Advent are purple for penitence or blue for hope.

Observing Advent is a meaningful, adventurous way to prepare for Christmas. Buy or make an Advent wreath and use candles of your choice: four blue, four purple, or three blue or purple and one pink. If you have a fifth spot, add one white Christ candle. During meals or devotions, light only one candle the first week. Add another for each new week (the pink candle traditionally marks the third week), concluding with the white candle (if you have one) on Christmas. The increasing light reminds us we're getting closer to celebrating

I asked God to grant me patience, and God said no. God said that patience is the byproduct of tribulation. It isn't granted; it's earned.


I asked God to give me happiness; God said no. God said he gives blessings; happiness is up to me.

PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE TO MAKE CHRIST'S LOVE KNOWN

The Joyous Noise recipient for the month of October totaled \$347.36 and was designated for Cole Noecker, a 5 year old little boy living in Tamaqua with his family. At the age of 1, Cole was diagnosed with a rare X-linked disorder called Snyder-Robinson Syndrome. Snyder-Robinson Syndrome impacts one in every 300 million people and is characterized by intellectual disability, muscle and bone abnormalities, and other developmental problems While Cole is unable to speak, his family notes that he is such a loving and caring soul. He is always so happy as you can tell by the constant smile and his laughter. Cole will be off to Kindergarten this fall! Cole currently utilizes a medical car seat in order to travel to doctors appointments and family outings, but he is quickly outgrowing this. Cole's doctor recommended that his parents, Lauren and Sebastian, begin looking into vehicles that will be able to transport Cole in his wheelchair. These vehicles come with a large price tag. The Joyous Noise collection will be donated to the family to use towards the purchase of a vehicle that will be able to properly transport Cole.

The Joyous Noise recipient for the month of November has been designated as Operation Christmas Child. Operation Christmas Child is a ministry project run by Samaritan's Purse. Since 1993, God has used Samaritan's Purse to deliver over 200 million Operation Christmas Child shoebox gifts to children in need and disciple 50 million of these boys and girls.

The Joyous Noise recipient for the month of December has been designated as PA Wounded Warrior. Pennsylvania Wounded Warriors, Inc. was founded on one major goal - to help over 1200 veterans and families each year with over \$1,500,000 in assistance. They provide emergency financial assistance to veterans to help pay for housing, utilities, transportation, medical and other expenses. They pay directly to landlords, vendors and creditors. Pennsylvania's veterans have served their nation in every conflict. Many of these men and women are recovering physically, mentally or emotionally at a military hospital, Veteran's Administration medical facility or with their families at home – and are in need of financial support. Through generous donations, they are able to assist our Pennsylvania veterans.
