

### **Joyous Noise Offering**

#### PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE TO MAKE CHRIST'S LOVE KNOWN

August's Joyous Noise total was \$172.30. Money was also collected during the week of Vacation Bible School as a free will offering from children in attendance, as well as during the closing program at West Penn Park. Through these three donation opportunities, a total of \$665.60 was raised for this year's VBS Operation Kid-to-Kid Mission Project to send school supplies to teachers and students on Native American reservations. \$1 can supplement school supplies for one child for a whole year!

The Joyous Noise recipient for the month of September has been designated as the family of Mark Boyle. Mark tragically died on Wednesday, August 2, 2023 as a result of injuries sustained during an incident at his West Penn Business, Mark T. Boyle Welding LLC. Mark was a 2006 graduate of Tamaqua Area High School. In 2007 he ventured out on his own forming Mark T. Boyle Welding LLC, a welding, sandblasting, and painting company, and Mark T. Boyle 570 LLC. Trucking.

Mark avidly supported the community by dedicating his time and talents wherever they were needed. Mark leaves behind his wife Elizabeth and young daughters Emma, Ava, and McKenzie.

The Joyous Noise recipient for the month of October has been designated as Cole Noecker, a 5 year old little boy living in Tamaqua with his family. At the age of 1, Cole was diagnosed with a rare X-linked disorder called Snyder-Robinson Syndrome. Snyder-Robinson Syndrome impacts one in every 300 million people and is characterized by intellectual disability, muscle and bone abnormalities, and other developmental problems. While Cole is unable to speak, his family notes that he is such a loving and caring soul. He is always so happy as you can tell by the constant smile and his laughter. Cole will be off to Kindergarten this fall! Cole currently utilizes a medical car seat in order to travel to doctors appointments and family outings, but he is quickly outgrowing this. Cole's doctor recommended that his parents, Lauren and Sebastian, begin looking into vehicles that will be able to transport Cole in his wheelchair. These vehicles come with a large price tag. The Joyous Noise collection will be donated to the family to use towards the purchase of a vehicle that will be able to properly transport Cole.


We will start September and October off learning about the letters A thru F, the numbers 0-3, circle and square shapes and the colors yellow, orange, and black.


