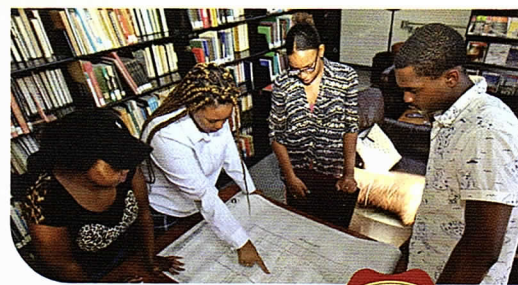




WHY TUSKEGEE UNIVERSITY?

TUSKEGEE UNIVERSITY is an independent and state-related institution of higher education. TU's programs serve a student body that is coeducational as well as racially, ethnically, and religiously diverse.

Tuskegee University is located in Tuskegee, Alabama, which is 40 miles east of the Alabama State Capitol in Montgomery, Alabama, and 20 miles west of the city of Auburn, Alabama. It is also within easy driving distance to Birmingham, Alabama, and Atlanta, Georgia.

The University is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC).

Tuskegee University was the first black college to be designated as a Registered National Historic Landmark (April 2, 1966) and the only black college to be designated a National Historic Site (October 26, 1974), a district administered by the National Park Service of the U. S. Department of Interior.

WHO IS THE TUSKEGEE UNIVERSITY STUDENT?

The TU student is one that is ready to challenge themselves among talented classmates and top-notch professors on a residential campus full of rich history and beauty.

Tuskegee is a well-respected university. Our graduates are sought after by companies and agencies from around the world.

- The only historically black college or university (HBCU) with a fully accredited College of Veterinary Medicine that offers a Doctoral Degree and produces over 75% of the African-American veterinarians in the world.
- The only HBCU in the nation designated as the location for National Center for Bioethics in Research and Health Care.
- The first nursing baccalaureate program in Alabama and one of the oldest in the United States.
- Originator and producer of the famous "Tuskegee Airmen," in partnership with the U.S. Army Air Corps.

APPLYING TO TUSKEGEE UNIVERSITY

There are two paths to being admitted to Tuskegee University:

STANDARD PREFERRED ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

This option is for students who have earned:

- 21 ACT Composite Score
- 1080 SAT Score (Evidence-Based Reading and Writing + Math)
- Unweighted 3.0 cumulative high school grade point average

TEST-OPTIONAL ADMISSION

This option is an alternative for applicants who meet the minimum GPA requirement but feel that their test scores do not adequately reflect their academic abilities or potential.

- No test scores required
- Minimum unweighted 3.0 GPA required
- Recommendation letter from a high school counselor, teacher, or community leader required
- 500-word (max) essay required

**The preferred standard criteria is an average. However, every file is evaluated on its own merit.*

Choose from over 100 registered student organizations, including honor societies, religious clubs, Greek-letter, service, study abroad, and professional organizations.

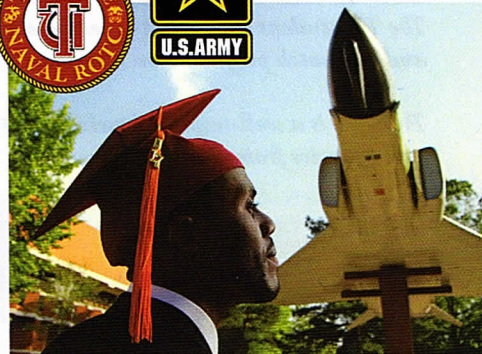


ROTC
