A Note from Phil A Three-Week Sermon Series "Thirsty For…"

As we read the Gospel of John, we hear the lively accompaniment of water as it sings over the scripture in John's stories. Behind so many scenes is the play and tumbling of water: the Baptizer's River, the six stone jars full of water, the well in Samaria, the pool of Bethesda, the raging sea, washing blind eyes, and the washing of dirty feet. Even when the dead body of Jesus is pierced with a spear blood <u>and</u> water flow out of the One who is *"Living Water."* Yet, the irony of the symbol of water as Jesus said from the cross, *"I thirst,"* the very source and giver of *"Living Water,"*

We all thirst for something... Jesus knows and understands our thirsts. Over the next three Sundays we will look at the Samaritan women at the well – thirsty for something more and leaving the brokenness of the past (John 4:1-30); the paralytic at the pool – thirsty for healing (John 5:1-15); and the man born blind –thirsty to see the light even in barren the wilderness (John 9:1-41).

As we gather for these Sundays during the hot dogdays of August the symbol of water speaks to our physical thirst. Yet even more, have you named or know your thirst that leaves your soul dry and searching? Come join us and invite friends as we come to the well of "Living water."

August 6 – Thirsty for More – Leaving the Old Behind (John 4:4-15;28-29)

August 13 – Thirsty for Healing (John 5:1-8)

August 20 – Thirsty for Opening Blind Eyes (John 9:1-11;24-25)

As you "wade" into these texts in preparing for worship, listen for the sounds of life-giving water flowing over the stories like a subterranean stream. The symbol has varied meanings like at the Pool of Bethesda. Yet, Jesus remains the source, provider, and symbol of "living water" for our deepest thirst. The Psalmist pleads, "My soul thirst for God, for the living God. Where can I go and meet with God?" Take the journey and come to the well... Come to worship... You just might discover what has been missing.
