July social for a week and postponed the Biker Games activities for the second month. Let's hope that the next couple of months are sunny, and we can all get back to our usual routines.


A few of us gambled on the rain not coming for the ride through the Adirondacks, and won. We had a sunny day and clean twisty roads.

What does VT Rte 17 have to offer?

It's a fun road to ride with great views and 53 turns!

The Appalachian Gap (a.k.a. 'the App Gap')- Rocky Dale to Waitsfield

Gap elevation: 615 to 2,287 feet (186 to 697 metres)

The Appalachian Gap is the most popular route of the 6 Gaps in Vermont. It is often frequented by motorcyclists because of its many twisties and switchbacks (53 of them!).

When you ride the Gap on Route 17, you pass over 'Baby Gap' to descend 269 feet (82 metres) before you reach the big one. Appalachian Gap is steep – rising up 1,253 feet (382 metres), and it's full of up-hill twisties. The view from the summit is stunning; on clear days you can see all the way to the Adirondack Mountains, Lake Champlain Valley and the road for the upcoming descent. On the way down, watch out for cars; there's a popular ski resort here with traffic all year round. Finish the Appalachian Gap in Waitsfield.

A little history of part of the land route 17 runs through:

Buels Gore is located at the southern tip of Chittenden County, bordered by the town of Huntington to the north, Fayston in Washington County to the east, and Starksboro in Addison County to the west. The crest of the Green Mountains, followed by the Long Trail, runs through the eastern side of the gore, and Vermont Route 17 crosses the gore from east to west, cresting the mountains at Appalachian Gap.

According to the United States Census Bureau, Buels Gore has a total area of 5.0 square miles (12.9 km2), of which 0.004 square miles (0.01 km2), or 0.08%, is water.

The gore was chartered by the Vermont



General Assembly on November 4, 1780. It is named for Major Elias Buel (in some references "Buell") who moved to Vermont from Coventry, Connecticut. With a group of would-be proprietors including Ira Allen and several Buel family members, the group petitioned the legislature for a grant. They received a grant for a town, intended to be called "Coventry" near Shoreham. Due to a surveying error there was almost no land left in the grant. The group returned to the legislature and received a "flying grant", a sort of license which allowed a grant to be made on uncharted land that could be identified. As much of the state had by now been organized, they finally settled upon three unconnected pieces of land. The largest became the present town of Coventry in Orleans County. A second piece near Coventry was named "Coventry Leg" for its appendage shape. Coventry Leg was annexed to Newport in 1816. The final small piece, adjacent to Huntington, was called "Huntington Gore", and renamed "Buels Gore", despite Major Buel's desire to call it "Montzoar". All three charters were issued in October 1788, though dated back to 1780, the year of the original petition. Buel was charged retroactive taxes on the grant, a debt that only resolved by sale of all of his lands. He left Vermont to settle in New York.
