Last year, a Revitalization Committee was formed to view properties around the City and determine if they are out of compliance with the ordinance- unsafe, grass unmowed etc. The letters was then sent by the Revitalization Committee and residents are given a specific timeframe in which to rectify the condition for which the letters was sent. Council members do not send, nor do they receive copies of these letters. A copy of each certified letter sent is on file with City Clerk in the City Hall.

10. CITY ENGINEER REPORT:

John Doyle went over the sewer project. John stated that the entire sewer project is approximately 10% complete. The final easement was received this week. At one point this week, the Contractor hit solid rock and the equipment he has is not large enough to break through. They will be getting a larger piece of equipment to get through the rock in that area. Weather has also played a role in the progress of the project. Even with these obstacles, the project is pretty much on track. The bill that the Council approved for payment at the beginning of the meeting includes each facet of the project and what percentage of that particular facet is complete, and the cost. Anyone in the Community who is interested in reviewing the bill and project progress is welcome to do so at City Hall.
