1. CALL TO ORDER

5. ADOPT THE AGENDA

11. HANDHELDS
Discussion was held regarding the purchase of two new water meter reading handhelds. The existing handheld is outdated and has been causing issues with the reads each month. Michael Gunther made a motion to purchase two handheld meters with training for \$7,618.50; seconded by Anthony Campbell. 12. DCA-LEONNA COFFMAN
The DCA would like to have the Car & Bike Show next March or April in Dixon. They will have the burnout competition in front of City Hall and food vendors. Details are still being ironed out. The DCA has insurance for the event with Hartford. The council is in full support of the event.
13. TRASH RATES
The existing contract with GFL states a rate increase effective October 1, 2023. Discussion was held regarding the ongoing problems with the trash service. Council decided to continue with the existing 10% rate charge. This will impact resident's trash bills slightly.
14. APPROVE FY23 BUDGET

15. BUSINESS LICENSES
Trevor Warnol made a motion to approve all business licenses (OTG LLC, Plumlee & Sons Lawn Care Service, Spreign Enterprises, River Rock Electrical, Moore Drywall LLC, Richards Construction & Contracting LLC) with the exception of I-44 Plumbing. Motion seconded by Michael Gunther. Roll call to vote: Michael Gunther, Anthony Campbell, Stacey Yoakum, Trevor Warnol, Mary Wiles
Motion carried 5-0

16. LIBRARY UPDATE

The Back to School Fair was a huge success. We gave out character pens and stickers along with binders that the Caring Center had for us to hand out. Connie Erisman did a read aloud of her new children's book on August 8 where she sold and signed copies. The Summer Reading Program ended on September 1 with over 30 participants. Several earned free ice cream and a few free pizza. Stop by the Library for Cow Days t-shirts and cow tickets.

17. POLICE UPDATE

Chief Durbin gave an update on the Dixon Police Department. In the month of August: 319 calls of service, 14 Agency Assists, 92 phone calls, 3 unresponsive/unconscious (1 overdose/1 medical/1 unfounded), 9 suspicious activities, 10 disturbances, 41 walk-ins and 3 motor vehicle accident (injury).

18. MAINTENANCE UPDATE

Pat Ragan reported Sixth Street will be concreted next week. This week the maintenance crew is cleaning the streets for Cow Days.
