1. CALL TO ORDER

3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

4. INVOCATION
Jack Caple gave the invocation.
5. ADOPT THE AGENDA

6. RATIFY BILLS

7. APPROVE SEPTEMBER 12, 2022 MINUTES
Trevor Warnol made the motion to approve the minutes of September 12, 2022, Stacey Yoakum seconded the motion. Roll call to vote: Stacey Yoakum, Barbara Thomas-

8. PROPERTY ON N ELM 402 & 404 – JACK & ANGIE ACORD
Jack and Angie Acord presented the council with a map from Pulaski County that outlined and confirmed the mismatched property lines at 402A & 404A. The Acords would like to purchase a portion of the property that belongs to the City of Dixon so the property lines match. Attorney Jeff Thomas stated that the land should be surveyed and discussion

regarding the sale of real estate should be during closed session. Mayor Mike Null advised the Acords to type up an offer and submit it to the council for consideration.

9. PULASKI COUNTY OEM – SHAUNA MCCULLOUGH

Shauna from Pulaski County Office of Emergency Management presented the council with a mass communication system for the state of Missouri. This would be a cost share for the counties and cities in Missouri. The HyperReach system has the ability for each person to customize the way communication is received. This system would have the ability to: Integrate with National Weather Service, Social Media, Reach visitors to the area, communicate regarding water outages, weapon issues, weather, boil order, etc. The total cost per municipality is \$2,083 per year using cost share equaling \$12,500 for Pulaski County as a whole. ARPA funds can be used to pay the cost.

Shauna is the point of contact for Dixon and is here to assist. She will follow-up at the November council meeting and provide contact information to the council.

10. DIXON COMMUNITY ALLIANCE – FALL FEST

Leonna Coffman asked the council to close streets on October 29 for Fall Fest. This falls on the same date as Trunk or Treat. Leonna is requesting Elm Street be closed from 7am-8pm and 2nd Street to be closed in the evening. The council was concerned with the safety of the Trunk or Treat pedestrians as people are leaving the Fall Fest. Another concern is the trash pickup following the event as this was problematic following Cow Days. Mayor Null instructed the DCA to provide the following: Proof of Event Insurance, a Performance Bond to ensure streets are cleaned and a list of expectations for the event.

15. INSURANCE UPDATE

Mayor Mike Null reported that the insurance agreement needs to have the amount the insurance premium will be per person. Kelli Livengood will get the appropriate information to the council.

The MCHCP Insurance has been cancelled due to low enrollment and we are going with an Anthem plan effective October 1, 2022.

16. STREET LIGHTS

Mayor Mike Null reported that additional street lights are \$8 per month per light. If anyone is aware of an area that needs a light it should be reported to City Hall. If a utility pole needs to be added that may be at an additional cost. Deanna Burns reported Barnett and Sloan requests have already been made. The city collects the information and sends it to Gascosage. Stacey Yoakum asked if we got a quote to go to LED lights and Deanna Burns answered with no.

17. LIBRARY UPDATE

Librarian, Lacey Rollins, reported that she is available to assist folks with signing up for the emergency management system if we put it in place. Ms. Rollins also reported her most recent special event was the Preparedness Course was well attended with 17 people. Last month traffic was good for the library. Ms. Rollins is planning a Financial Literacy Day at the end of October or first part of November. She will be at the Trunk or Treat and is planning a Santa visit to the library on December 3. Lacey has been busy purging books that are outdated or that haven't been checked out in 20+ years. She will be planning some craft days to utilize the abundance of books being purged and then sell the crafts to generate money for the library. The Council agreed that was a good idea. Lacey does have extra Cow Days shirts for sale.

Lacey shared the new library hours with the council: 10:30am-5:30pm Monday through Friday and Saturdays for special events only.

18. POLICE UPDATE

Sergeant John Durbin reported Dixon PD took 196 in-city calls, 17 assist calls with Pulaski County, 2 assist calls with Maries County, 77 informational calls for a total of 292 calls for the month of September. John also reported the 2016 Explorer is broke down again and we've just ordered a new turbo for it. The white Tahoe still doesn't have AC and has been worked on several times. Mayor Null suggested John take it to the dealership to fix it.

Sergeant Durbin also reported the staff is at a minimum. The building renovation is coming along better now. A roll-off dumpster has been ordered to get rid of the trash and clutter in the PD.

19. MAINTENANCE UPDATE

Pat Ragan reported that he is not able to find parts for the 6th street project. Trevor Warnol mentioned he may know where they can be found. Pat will follow-up with Trevor. Pat also reported that the City of Dixon purchased the Motor Road Grader and it should be delivered in the next few weeks.
