SUBJECT ENHANCEMENT SESSIONS

Great attendance has also been seen in the Subject Enhancement Sessions. These, I feel have really helped pupils prepare for the assessments and will continue until the summer examinations.

After the results have been analysed from the recent assessments, the timetable for each pupil will be changed to reflect any particular need that is required. Each pupil will therefore receive a personalised copy of their new timetable shortly.

It is worth noting that whilst these sessions are 30-40 minutes in length, it might be necessary to stay longer, by arrangement with the class teacher for vocational subjects with coursework requirements. I.e. Drama, Art or Music for example. Hard work, now, will be the 'passport to progress' your son/ daughter needs to get the best GCSE grades possible.

MENTORING

Mentoring is continuing throughout the year. Pupils should now be beginning to apply for post 16 courses/apprenticeship. These small group or individual sessions are planned in alternate Wednesday mornings, to give pupils the help and support in examinations or in applying for the right courses.
