 - Raised over an estimated \$10,000 in local business and resident support for community events.




- Managed contributions of labor and materials in excess of an estimated \$15,000 to community center building improvements and upgrades.

• Coordinated multiple direct outreach and community engagement efforts to help bridge communications between new and existing residents including assisting the City with Oxford community streetscape improvement efforts and planning.







• Facilitated dedication and formal naming of the park at Oxford and Holton which was provided by the Design Collaborative who donated design services, labor, and

materials; estimated value in excess of \$50,000; estimated value to the community, *priceless*.
