• Reason: E410 & M410B found 68 year old male in Cardiac Arrest secondary to asthma attack. E410 started CPR with BLS airway while M410B prepared for oral intubation. E410 reported that it was getting difficult to ventilate patient. CPR was continued using LUCAS device. I/O started and meds/fluids delivered. Intubation attempt made by M410B (Barrone & Heufelder) crew reported they could see vocal cords in Laryngospasm in King Vision. One intubation attempt made without success. Quick decision was made to do surgical airway. Anthony Barrone (ALS Intern) with assistance from Nick Heufelder preformed surgical airway in apartment. Pt transported to Fairfax ER with CPR in progress, ACLS medications delivered and surgical airway in place. FF St Clair, Technician Allen, VFF Barrone, Tech Heufelder and myself were in back of M410B. Approximately 2 minutes prior to arrival pulse check done, very weak pulse detected. Patient care transferred to Fairfax ER staff with pulse of 120 and blood pressure of 113/90.
